


Confidentiality

Your personal information is kept confidential. The Census Bureau is bound by federal law to protect your information, and your data is used only for statistical purposes.

Your responses are compiled with information from other homes to produce statistics, which never identify your home or any person in your home.



Language Support

You can complete the online questionnaire in the following languages: English, Spanish, Chinese (Simplified), Vietnamese, Korean, Russian, Arabic, Tagalog, Polish, French, Haitian Creole, Portuguese, and Japanese.

To help you respond, the Census Bureau also offers web pages and guides in 59 non-English languages, including American Sign Language, as well as guides in Braille and large print.

- Your Social Security Number
- Money or donations
- Anything on behalf of a political party
- Your bank or credit card account numbers



Who Should Be Counted & Where?

You should be counted where you were living and sleeping most of the time as of April 1, 2020. If you are responding for your home, count everyone who was living and sleeping there most of the time as of April 1, 2020. This includes young children, foster children, roommates, and any family members or friends who are living with you, even temporarily. PLEASE NOTE: that if someone was staying with you temporarily on April 1 due to the COVID-19 situation, they should be counted where they usually live.



Your Unique Census ID

The quickest way to respond to the 2020 Census is online with your Census ID, which easily links your response with your address. This ID can be found on the letter or questionnaire you received from the Census Bureau. Only one person per household should use your Census ID. If you have not received anything from the Census Bureau yet, you can still respond online without your Census ID.
