CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Ervin called the June 14, 2021 regular meeting of Florence City Council to order at 1:05 p.m.

INVOCATION

Mayor Ervin gave the invocation for the meeting. The pledge of allegiance to the American Flag followed the invocation.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Councilman Schofield made a motion to adopt the minutes of the April 23, 2021 Planning Retreat, the May 10, 2021 Regular Meeting, the May 13, 2021 Special Meeting, and the May 18, 2021 Work Session and Councilwoman Barnes seconded the motion. The minutes were unanimously adopted.



A public hearing will be held to receive input on the City of Florence Fiscal Year Budget 2021-2022.

Mayor Ervin opened the public hearing at 1:07 p.m. Being no public comment on the City of Florence FY 2021-2022 budget, Mayor Ervin closed the public hearing at 1:07 p.m.

A public hearing will be held to receive input on adoption of an ordinance titled "a second supplemental ordinance providing for the issuance and sale of City of Florence, South Carolina, stormwater system revenue bonds, Series 2021, in the principal amount of not exceeding \$7,000,000; and other matters relating thereto."

Mayor Ervin opened the public hearing at 1:08 p.m. Being no public comment, Mayor Ervin closed the public hearing at 1:08 p.m.

APPEARANCE BEFORE COUNCIL

Reverend Leo Woodberry

Reverend Woodberry and Anthony Hall with the New Alpha Community Development Corporation appeared before Council to share information regarding federal policy and funding opportunities around the issues of climate change, infrastructure, and the environment. Mr. Hall said members of their organization have been working on these issues for years and have partnerships with international, national, regional, and state organizations. In 2019, they were funded to work with several organizations in the southeast to put together a Southern Communities Green New Deal platform with policy recommendations. They are currently working with the Biden Administration initiative called the Justice 40, which will direct grants, resources, and support to community-based organizations. Mr. Hall announced that New Alpha Community Development Corporation, The Whitney M Slater Foundation, Kingdom Living Temple, along with its partners from the South Carolina Environmental Justice Network, will be forming community-based organizations stakeholder groups and will be establishing one in the City of Florence and across the Pee Dee. He said they have appeared before Council to ask the city to position itself to receive potential funding from both the federal and state governments. He said the city can do this with a four-prong framework that includes a minority business development agreement, community benefits agreement, a fair share agreement and a commission or board to work on sustainability and resilience issues from a litigation and adaptation approach. He also asked that the city establish ongoing meetings with New Alpha CDC, its partners and community-based shareholder groups.

Mr. Woodberry said the Justice 40 initiative has been released by the White House and it is his desire for the city to take action so they are well positioned to receive some of this funding to help with climate, infrastructure and environmental issues.

<u>Addendum to the Agenda</u> Councilman Frank J. "Buddy" Brand, Florence County Council

Pro tem Jebaily made a motion to add this Appearance Before Council to the June 14, 2021 Regular Meeting agenda and Councilwoman Moore seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

Councilman Brand briefly spoke and said he was present today to increase communications between the city the county. Historically, the city and county have not worked together enough. He said the city and



county need to work together from an economic development viewpoint, school district viewpoint, medical hospital viewpoint, quality of life viewpoint and communication viewpoint. The city and county must work together and communicate in order to succeed.

Mayor Ervin thanked Councilman Brand and said he is a great bridge between the city and county. Having been on City Council for so many years will allow him to be a great resource.

ORDINANCES IN POSITION

Councilman Schofield made a motion to adopt Bill No. 2021-11 on second reading and Councilwoman Barnes seconded the motion.

Council voted unanimously (7-0) to adopt Bill No. 2021-11.

Bill No. 2021-13 - Second Reading

An Ordinance to amend the Planned Development District for The Grove at Ebenezer.

Councilwoman Moore made a motion to adopt Bill No. 2021-13 on second reading and Councilman Schofield seconded the motion.

Council voted unanimously (7-0) to adopt Bill No. 2021-13.

INTRODUCTION OF ORDINANCES

Bill No. 2021-12 - First Reading

An Ordinance to annex and zone a portion of Lake Oakdale and the Lake Oakdale dam, identified as a portion of Florence County Tax Map Parcel 00751-01-049.

Mr. Dudley said the applicants have requested that this item be deferred. Without objection, this item was deferred.

Bill No. 2021-14 - First Reading

An Ordinance to annex and zone the parcel located at 2495 Hoffmeyer Road, identified as Florence County Tax Map Parcel 01221-01-109.

Councilwoman Moore made a motion to pass Bill No. 2021-14 on first reading and Councilwoman Barnes seconded the motion.

Mr. Jerry Dudley, Planning Director, reported this is the site of a single-family residential structure and is currently unzoned in the county. Planning Commission held a public hearing on this matter and voted unanimously to recommend the zoning request.

Council voted unanimously (7-0) to pass Bill No. 2021-14. Bill No. 2021-15 – First Reading



An Ordinance to annex and zone 2504 Abbey Way, 2513 Abbey Way, 2485 Parsons Gate, and 2502 Parsons Gate, identified as Florence County Tax Map Parcels 01221-01-254, 01221-01-261, 01221-01-305, and 01221-01-283.

Pro tem Jebaily made a motion to pass Bill No. 2021-15 on first reading and Councilman Schofield seconded the motion.

Mr. Dudley reported these properties are single-family detached homes located in the rear of Windsor Forest Subdivision and water and sewer services are currently available.

Planning Commission held a public hearing on this matter and voted unanimously to recommend the zoning of NC-15.

Council voted unanimously (7-0) to pass Bill No. 2021-15.

Bill No. 2021-16 - First Reading

An Ordinance to annex and zone the parcel located at 3136 Pisgah Road, identified as Florence County Tax Map Parcel 00097-01-029.

Councilwoman Barnes made a motion to pass Bill No. 2021-16 on first reading and Councilwoman Moore seconded the motion.

Mr. Dudley reported the proposed zoning for this parcel is RG-3, General Residential. This parcel is adjacent to the recent annexation for the future Pisgah Point Subdivision, which was zoned RG-3 upon annexation. City water service is currently available. City sewer service is currently unavailable and the applicant has signed a sewer release form; however, there is potential for sewer availability with the development of Pisgah Point Subdivision. If/when sewer becomes available, the homeowner will have five years to connect by city ordinance.

Planning Commission held a public hearing on this matter and voted unanimously to recommend the zoning request of RG-3.

Council voted unanimously (7-0) to pass Bill No. 2021-16.

Bill No. 2021-17 - First Reading

An Ordinance to rezone from NC-6.2 to CBD the lots at 113 and 115 East Pine Street and 319 and 321 Railroad Avenue, identified as Florence County Tax Map Parcels 90087-06-001, 90087-06-002, 90087-06-005, and 90087-06-006.

Councilwoman Moore made a motion to pass Bill No. 2021-17 on first reading and Councilman McCall seconded the motion.

Mr. Dudley reported the parcels are currently zoned NC-6.2, Neighborhood Conservation-6.2. The proposed zoning is CBD, Central Business District. These lots are currently owned by the city and the city is working toward a conditional agreement with a private developer to construct townhomes intended for homeownership as part of the Neighborhood Revitalization effort.



CBD zoning is in agreement with surrounding zoning and Planning Commission voted unanimously to recommend the rezoning request. The design concept for development has also been before the Design Review Board and was approved.

Council voted unanimously (7-0) to pass Bill No. 2021-17.

Bill No. 2021-18 - First Reading

An Ordinance to declare Florence County Tax Map Parcels 90060-05-014 and 90060-06-008 as surplus and authorize the transfer of land to the Desolate Development Group.

Councilwoman Moore made a motion to pass Bill No. 2021-18 on first reading and Councilman McCall seconded the motion.

Mr. Dudley reported the properties in question are 708 Gladstone Street and 806 Gladstone Street. The city was approached by the Desolate Development Group to acquire these properties for the purpose of constructing detached single-family homes intended for homeownership and fits within the city's Neighborhood Revitalization strategy to entice private developers. The Desolate Development Group has recently constructed two new homes on Gladstone Street and is currently constructing a third home. One parcel is currently vacant, and one has a dilapidated structure which will be demolished by the buyer. Compensation for the properties has been established through a letter of intent.

Councilman Braddock inquired on the purchase price for the properties and Mr. Dudley replied 708 Gladstone Street is \$6,400 and 806 Gladstone Street is \$4,000.

Council voted unanimously (7-0) to pass Bill No. 2021-18.

Bill No. 2021-19 - First Reading

An Ordinance to raise revenue and adopt a budget for the City of Florence, South Carolina, for the Fiscal Year beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022.

Pro tem Jebaily made a motion to pass Bill No. 2021-19 on first reading and Councilwoman Moore seconded the motion.

Mr. Kevin Yokim, Assistant City Manager of Finance/Administration, reported before Council is the ordinance to approve the budget that was presented at the May 18, 2021 Work Session.

Pro tem Jebaily noted it has been a challenging year financially with shortfalls in revenues and took a moment to commend staff on their work to present a balanced budget.

Council voted unanimously (7-0) to pass Bill No. 2021-19.

Bill No. 2021-20 - First Reading;

A second supplemental Ordinance providing for the issuance and sale of City of Florence, South Carolina, stormwater system revenue bonds, Series 2021, in the principal amount of not exceeding \$7,000,000; and other matters relating thereto.

Councilman Schofield made a motion to pass Bill No. 2021-20 on first reading and Councilman Braddock seconded the motion.



Mr. Randy Osterman, City Manager, said during the May 18th Work Session, Pro tem Jebaily made a recommendation for the city to conduct a city-wide stormwater system study. The potential study will take approximately three years and cost approximately \$550,000. He said staff is confident the first year's expenses associated with the study will be covered in the presented budget.

Mr. Yokim said a list of projects for the 15-year bond issuance was presented to Council several months ago that amounted to \$6.6 million. He said Council discussed the projects and the amount of bond and whether or not to increase the storm water fee at the Work Session meeting. He further explained that the bond was set to the amount of not exceeding \$7 million in the ordinance for the purpose of the public hearing being held. Council may reduce the amount of the bond to \$4 million if they choose. Staff recommends the issuance of \$4 million in bonds for stormwater projects, which will allow the debt service on these bonds to be covered by the existing stormwater fee. To fund the cost of all the proposed projects would require the issuance of a \$7 million bond and an increase of \$0.50 in the stormwater fee and the budget ordinance that just passed on first reading does not include this stormwater fee increase.

Pro tem Jebaily inquired on a potential discrepancy with how the ordinance is worded, since staff is recommending the \$4 million bond issuance when the ordinance states \$7 million. Mr. Yokim said in preparation, staff asked the financial advisor to submit a request for proposals to various financial institutions for both the issuance of bonds not exceeding \$7 million as well as not exceeding \$4.5 million.

Councilwoman Moore said the public needs to know that the stormwater fee will remain the same for a \$4 million bond, but it will increase for the \$7 million bond. She said the \$7 million is for specific projects and will cause an increase in stormwater fees but will not fix everyone's stormwater issues.

Pro tem Jebaily asked if the language would need to be amended in the ordinance to go along with the \$4 million proposal. Mr. Charlton deSassure, the city's bond attorney, said the ordinance states that the Mayor is authorized to determine the aggregate principal amount of the bond and that amount would be set forth in a certificate and signed by the Mayor. The discussion for the bond is in a range with the upper part of the range authorized, but the ordinance would require the exact number to be certified by the Mayor.

Mr. Yokim clarified that the staff recommendation is the \$4 million, plus the cost of issuance, which will not necessitate an increase in stormwater fees. The projects included on the list will not address all the stormwater issues across the city.

Council voted unanimously (7-0) to pass Bill No. 2021-20.

Bill No. 2021-21 - First Reading

An Ordinance to amend Chapter 2 of the City of Florence Code of Ordinances by adding additional sections to Article III to establish the Aesthetics Advisory Committee.

Mayor Ervin made a motion to pass Bill No. 2021-21 on first reading and Councilman McCall seconded the motion.

Mr. Scotty Davis, Deputy City Manager, said this Bill is sponsored by Mayor Ervin. The advisory committee will research, investigate, recommend, and support a culture of stewardship, striving to develop and enhance an aesthetic environment where every neighborhood will be a place that is attractive and inviting.



Councilman Braddock said the vision of this advisory committee seemingly duplicates the purpose of the Community Redevelopment Committee recently established by City Council. He said the Community Redevelopment Committee was a product from the two-day Planning Retreat session with Council and members of staff. He said he feels establishing this committee would be a shift by Council of their responsibilities to the citizens to this advisory committee. He said this advisory committee is granted several powers that are not typically granted to committees, one being the ability for this committee to create its own ad hoc committees. He said his concern that these ad hoc committees would have no input from City Council, which creates more confusion and duplicates the current efforts of Council with the Community Redevelopment Committee. He said he cannot support taking the responsibilities encumbered to him as a Councilmember and shifting them to an advisory committee and he cannot move forward with this ordinance as written.

Councilman McCall said the Community Redevelopment Committee chaired by Councilwoman Barnes is an ad hoc committee comprised of members of Council; whereas, the Aesthetics Committee is an advisory committee to Council comprised of city residents. He suggested adding language to the ordinance in order to accomplish the Mayor's goals with the Aesthetics Committee and to clear up Councilman Braddock's concerns of the committee having too much leeway and to help eliminate duplication and confusion. Councilman McCall made a to amend Section 2-133 (c) and (d) to add language to the ordinance that states the advisory committee will work with and through the Community Redevelopment Committee of Council as well as the City Manager, and to amend Section 2-134 (e) to add language to the ordinance to state the ad hoc committees can be formed with the consent of City Council and upon recommendation of the Community Redevelopment Committee. Councilwoman Moore seconded the motion.

Councilwoman Moore asked Mr. Davis to explain to the difference between this Aesthetics Advisory Committee and the Community Redevelopment Committee. Mr. Davis said the Community Redevelopment Committee is a committee comprised of three Councilmembers that will be working with staff liaisons. This committee is charged with bringing forth policies, ideas and information before Council for Council to vote and for staff to execute plans. The Aesthetics Committee will be comprised of citizens appointed by Council. This will be an advisory committee to Council and would work in conjunction with other committees. Councilwoman Moore asked if the Aesthetics Committee would have any voting rights and Mr. Davis responded no, they are an advisory committee and would only have the ability to make recommendations to Council.

Mayor Ervin clarified the three Council committees do not have any voting authority. Council committees can work with the advisory committees and can make reports to Council.

Pro tem Jebaily said three Council Committees were established from the Planning Retreat meeting, each of these committees is comprised of three members of Council. He said it is his understanding that anything these committees come up with will only be in the form of a recommendation to Council. Three members of Council cannot make a decision on anything.

Council voted unanimously (7-0) to approve the amendment.

Councilman McCall made a motion to pass Bill No. 2021-21 on first reading, as amended and Councilwoman Barnes seconded the motion.

Council voted unanimously (7-0) to pass Bill No. 2021-21, as amended.

Bill No. 2021-22 - First Reading



An Ordinance to amend Chapter 2 of the City of Florence Code of Ordinances by adding additional sections to Article III to establish the Resilience and Sustainability Advisory Committee.

Councilwoman Moore made a motion to pass Bill No. 2021-22 on first reading and Councilman McCall seconded the motion.

Councilman McCall made a motion to amend Section 2-126 (b) and (c) to add language to the ordinance that states the advisory committee will work with and through the Community Redevelopment Committee of Council as well as the City Manager, and to amend Section 2-127 (e) to add language to the ordinance to state the ad hoc committees can be formed with the consent of City Council and upon recommendation of the Community Redevelopment Committee. Councilwoman Moore seconded the motion.

Councilman Braddock said the three Council committees will require reestablishment after the next election in two years and asked what effect it will have on the ordinance if the committees are not reestablished. Councilwoman Barnes also asked if this would make the Council Committees permanent or if they would remain ad hoc. Mr. Peterson approached the podium and said action taken on these ordinances will not change the formation of the Council committees established at the last meeting.

Council voted unanimously (7-0) to approve the amendment.

Councilwoman Moore made a motion to pass Bill No. 2021-22 on first reading, as amended and Councilman McCall seconded the motion.

Council voted unanimously (7-0) to pass Bill No. 2021-22, as amended.

Bill No. 2021-23 - First Reading

An Ordinance to amend Chapter 2 of the City of Florence Code of Ordinances by adding additional sections to Article III to establish the Public Safety Citizen's Review Board.

Councilwoman Moore made a motion to pass Bill No. 2021-23 on first reading and Councilman Schofield seconded the motion.

Mr. Davis reported this ordinance establishes an independent Public Safety Review Board that will be empowered to consider larger policy issues relative to the public safety departments and to hear specific concerns from the public. This Bill is sponsored by Councilman McCall.

Mayor Ervin said there is a citizen present to discuss this matter and recognized Ms. Brenda Dutcher. Ms. Dutcher expressed some concerns on the formation of this committee and asked what warranted the development of such a committee, how much input will civilians have on policies and procedures and will the grievances filed and their outcomes become public knowledge.

Councilman Braddock spoke, saying this committee will give the public a platform to address an issue and have their voice heard in the event something bad happens, potentially mitigating a negative reaction in the community.

Councilman McCall said he has been working on the establishment of this committee since he was elected in November and he has met with Chief Heidler on several occasions since its inception. He spoke on trust between minorities and law enforcement and said this is a step in the right direction to



build trust between the two. He said the independent review board is non-intrusive and serves to give the community a voice.

Ms. Dutcher asked again if the grievances and names of parties involved would become public information. She also asked what the criteria is to serve on the Board.

Mr. Davis said the meetings will be made public, but there is an executive session portion to the meetings in which no information will be made public. Mr. Davis said it is not the city's intent to publicize an officer's name. The review the board will present findings, along with any recommendations, to the city manager.

Mr. Osterman said this Board will benefit the city by providing him access to internal information, as well as external information, which will allow him to make a more informed decision. He said the Board does not have the ability to mandate punishment or exoneration, that authority lies with himself and Chief Heidler; however, the Board does allow the public to have their case heard by their peers.

Mayor Ervin thanked Ms. Dutcher for her appearance.

Council voted unanimously (7-0) to pass Bill No. 2021-23.

INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTIONS

Resolution No. 2021-16

A Resolution authorizing the Mayor and City Council to execute a Community Development Block Grant-Mitigation (CDBG-MIT) subrecipient agreement between the City of Florence and the South Carolina Disaster Recovery Office to fund an infrastructure improvement project that will mitigate the impact of future disasters.

Councilwoman Moore made a motion to adopt Resolution No. 2021-16 and Councilman McCall seconded the motion.

Mr. Dudley reported city staff made application for CDBG-Mitigation grant funds for three projects through the South Carolina Office of Resilience, Disaster Recovery Division and was awarded funds for two stormwater infrastructure projects, totaling \$4,048,811. The two projects that were awarded funding are the McQueen Street Infrastructure Project and the Cedar Street Infrastructure Project.

The scope of work for the McQueen Street Project involves the upgrade of stormwater infrastructure (pipe, inlets, and junction boxes) in the vicinity of McQueen Street to include stream restoration (daylighting) of a portion of Doe Branch. The project extends from the 400 block of North McQueen south to Timrod Park and includes infrastructure throughout the stormwater capture area for the McQueen Street trunk line. The scope of the Cedar Street Project involves the upgrade of stormwater infrastructure (pipe, inlets, and junction boxes) in the vicinity of West Cedar Street, which includes a commercial corridor (South Irby Street) and sections of the Timrod Park Neighborhood. The two projects work synergistically to improve drainage and upgrade failing infrastructure throughout the catch basin associated with Doe Branch and the McQueen Street trunk line.

Pro tem Jebaily asked if these projects are in addition to the projects to be completed with the stormwater bond to which Mr. Dudley said that is correct, these grants are a great opportunity to get extra projects completed.



Council voted unanimously (7-0) to adopt Resolution No. 2021-16.

Resolution No. 2021-17

A Resolution to proclaim the month of June as Homeownership Month in the City of Florence.

Councilwoman Moore made a motion to adopt Resolution No. 2021-17 and Councilman McCall seconded the motion.

Mr. Dudley reported on June 1, 2021, the President proclaimed the month of June as National Homeownership month. Homeownership month provides an opportunity for all citizens to recognize that homeownership is becoming more difficult to realize and sustain.

Council voted unanimously (7-0) to adopt Resolution No. 2021-17.

Resolution No. 2021-18

A Resolution to amend a Conditional Grant Agreement dated November 22, 2013 between the City of Florence and New Florence Investment, LLC.

Councilman Schofield made a motion to adopt Resolution No. 2021-18 and Councilman McCall seconded the motion.

Mr. Yokim reported the original capital investment from this project was expected to be \$10-11 million; however, the tax value of the new investment is approximately \$3 million. When the grant agreement was initially formatted, it was in the amount of \$850,000, which was the amount equal to the estimated total of 85% of the property taxes paid by the developer over the first seven years following the completion of the project. The total investment was not as much as originally anticipated. As a result, the payback period will need to be increased from seven years to eighteen years to make the grant work. The investor has agreed not to appeal the assessment by the County Assessor during the remaining life of the current TIF in exchange for this amendment.

Council voted 6-0 to adopt Resolution No. 2021-18 (Councilwoman Moore was not present for the vote).

Resolution No. 2021-19

A Resolution and Conditional Grant and Development Agreement to provide an incentive for the development of a project located within an Overlay District.

Mayor Ervin said staff has requested that this item be deferred. Without objection, this item was deferred.

Resolution No. 2021-20

A Resolution to designate ten (10) on-street parking spaces located on the north side of the 400 block of West Evans Street along the frontage of the McMillan Federal Building as "U.S. Marshals Parking Only".

Councilman Schofield made a motion to adopt Resolution No. 2021-20 and Councilman McCall seconded the motion.

Mr. Clint Moore, Assistant City Manager of Development, reported the U.S. Marshals Florence, SC office made a request to designate 10 of the newly constructed parking spaces associated with the West



Evans Streetscape project as "U.S. Marshals Parking Only." The West Evans Streetscape Project designated a total of 20 spaces in front of the McMillan Federal Building along West Evans Street, with 10 spaces along the north of West Evans and 10 spaces along the south. The 10 in question are the parking spaces on the north of West Evans, directly in front of the Federal Building. Mr. Moore further elaborated that a separate Resolution will need to be considered by Council to establish the parking regulations for the additional spaces along the south side of West Evans. By ordinance, 2-hour parking was established for the 100 and 200 blocks of West Evans Street, as well as the 100 blocks of North and South Dargan Street. CDM Smith recently conducted a parking study for downtown Florence in 2016 which recommended establishing on-street parking to facilitate the development and growth of downtown.

Councilwoman Moore spoke on limited parking downtown and said there is not enough handicap spaces. Mr. Moore said on-street handicap spaces are difficult to accommodate due to the age of the street, grading, etc., but they are typically offered on-site.

Councilwoman Barnes said she has similar concerns on limited parking downtown. She asked if the spaces would be limited to a specific timeframe or if there would never be any public parking there. Mr. Moore responded the request is to fully limit the parking to U.S. Marshals Only.

Pro tem Jebaily said downtown parking is precious and he does not think these spaces should be turned over. He said the city has worked hard over many years to develop a comprehensive, thoughtful approach to parking. These spaces will essentially become a no parking zone, the Marshal service will not even be utilizing the spaces. He said he respects the request, but he has a duty to the citizens, and he encourages staff to explore the potential for these spaces to be handicap. Mr. Moore did note that the sidewalks and sidewalk access within the corridor have all been built to ADA standards but it is difficult to meet ADA standards for on-street parking which is why they are typically established off the street. Currently downtown handicap parking is offered in all the surface lots and parking decks and there are some located in the 200 block of West Evans Street. Mr. Moore said staff can investigate ways to accommodate more.

Councilman Braddock said the Marshals have asked the city to designate the parking, but what will happen when they are told no. Mr. Osterman approached the podium to respond. He said the Marshals' request is based on security concerns for the Federal Building. He said he can continue conversations with them with the concerns that have been brought up and try to resolve all issues and go from there. Councilman Braddock questioned the use of eminent domain or any actions they can take. Mr. Peterson spoke, saying he's never seen a situation in which the federal government has used eminent domain for this sort of request but that does not mean it doesn't exist. He said their request is not because the Marshals need parking, it is because they view it as a security risk to allow parking that close to a federal court building.

Councilman Schofield said he understands the city needs more parking spaces and more handicap spaces downtown, but he sides with the Marshals on this matter. He said it is not a good idea to allow people to park in front of the building that could potentially have a lethal threat to the building.

Councilman McCall proposed only restricting the parking Monday through Friday, from 9am-5pm. He made a motion to defer this matter so that may take the suggestion to the Marshals for consideration and Councilwoman Moore seconded the motion.

Council voted unanimously to defer Resolution No. 2021-20.



Resolution No. 2021-21

A Resolution to honor basketball legend Pearl Moore on her induction into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame.

Councilman McCall made a motion to adopt Resolution No. 2021-21 and Councilwoman Barnes seconded the motion.

Mr. Scotty Davis reported that Pearl Moore is a four-time All American and the all-time career-scoring leader for women's college basketball. When at Francis Marion University, she averaged 30.6 points per game. She is a Florence native and graduate of Wilson High School.

Pro tem Jebaily and Councilwoman Barnes both expressed their enthusiasm towards this Resolution.

Councilwoman Moore said Pearl Moore is only the third South Carolinian to be inducted into the Naismith Hall of Fame.

Mayor Ervin said she was part of Council when the Pearl Moore Basketball Gymnasium came to fruition. She said Pearl Moore has made history with her accomplishments and with the induction to the hall of fame, but she also made history by being the only government building in the city named after a female.

Council voted unanimously (7-0) to adopt Resolution No. 2021-21.

REPORTS TO COUNCIL

Mr. Jerry Dudley, Planning Director

Mr. Dudley gave an update on an amendment to the Unified Development Ordinance regarding the Commercial Reuse District. He said at the April City Council meeting, Council deferred a rezoning request for property located on Oakland Avenue and Maxwell Street. At the request of Council, Planning Commission studied sections of the Unified Development Ordinance in regard to the Commercial Reuse District. During this time staff also began researching and putting together some suggestions for potential amendments to the Unified Development Ordinance and these suggestions were presented as a draft amendment at the June Planning Commission meeting in which Planning Commission ultimately decided to defer. There were concerns among Planning Commission members on protection among surrounding residential uses and unintended consequence with putting rules into place. The amendment will go before Planning Commission again next month.

Councilwoman Moore expressed frustration with all the amendments to the Unified Development Ordinance. Mr. Dudley said any zoning code is going to evolve over time and will require amendments.

Councilman McCall said he was under the impression that the intent was to find a way for this existing nonconformity to comply with code. Mr. Dudley said spot zoning or zoning for one property is not allowed. Once amendments are adopted, the code would apply to any similar situation moving forward.

Appointments to Boards and Commissions

Judicial Review Ad Hoc Committee



Mr. Davis reported Council traditionally appoints a Judicial Review Ad Hoc Committee to make recommendations on the appointments of city judges. He said the Mayor typically appoints members of Council to this committee. Current serving judges have all indicated their desire to continue serving.

Without objection, Mayor Ervin appointed Councilman McCall, Councilman Schofield, and Councilwoman Moore to the Judicial Review Ad Hoc Committee.

Community Redevelopment Committee

The Community Redevelopment Committee is chaired by Councilwoman Barnes. Without objection, Councilwoman Barnes appointed Councilman McCall and Councilwoman Moore to the committee.

Marketing and Public Relations Committee

The Marketing and Public Relations Committee is chaired by Councilman McCall. Without objection, Councilman McCall appointed Councilman Braddock and Pro tem Jebaily to the committee.

Business Development Committee

The Business Development Committee is chaired by Pro tem Jebaily. Without objection, Pro tem Jebaily appointed Councilwoman Barnes and Councilman Schofield to the committee.

Councilwoman Barnes made an announcement on an upcoming event. On June 26, 2021 there will be a community clean-up. The event will begin at First Baptist Church at 7:00 a.m. and any volunteers are welcome.

CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Ervin called the June 21, 2021 special meeting of Florence City Council to order at 4:06 p.m.

INVOCATION

Mayor Ervin gave the invocation for the meeting. The pledge of allegiance to the American Flag followed the invocation.

ORDINANCES IN POSITION

Bill No. 2021-19 - Second Reading

An Ordinance to raise revenue and adopt a budget for the City of Florence, South Carolina, for the Fiscal Year beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022.

Councilman McCall made a motion to adopt Bill No. 2021-19 on second reading and Councilwoman Moore seconded the motion.

Councilman Schofield made a motion to amend Section 1(d) of Bill No. 2021-19 to increase the budget for the stormwater utility enterprise fund to \$1,663,000 and to amend Section 12-272(a)(2) of the City of Florence, SC Code of Ordinances to increase the stormwater fee for each residential unit by \$0.50 per month to \$3.84 per month. Councilwoman Barnes seconded the motion.

Councilwoman Moore said she is opposed to the increase because the city already increased water and roll-cart fees and residents do not need more increases at this time. Further, when residents are paying more in stormwater fees, they do not expect their streets to be flooded.

Pro tem Jebaily asked for clarity on the amendments. Councilman Schofield said both amendments will allow the city to increase the stormwater fee in order to obtain the \$7 million bond issuance. Mr. Kevin Yokim, Assistant City Manager of Finance/Administration, said the current stormwater utility enterprise fund for next fiscal year is \$1,460,500. The revenue generated in that fund from the \$0.50 per month increase will be approximately \$200,000 per year, plus the debt service on the \$7 million bond; therefore, in order to account for the \$0.50 increase, the budget fund needs to be increased.

Councilwoman Barnes said she has been asking people in the community their opinion on the city's stormwater issues and a potential increase and fee. The feedback she received was that it would be irresponsible if there was no attempt to fix the issues.

Councilman Braddock spoke in favor of the increase. He said one of the top complaints he hears from residents is of stormwater issues and Council has the ability to start addressing these issues.

Councilwoman Moore spoke again, saying increasing the stormwater fee is not going to solve everyone's stormwater issues; the city needs to look at other solutions. She said it was previously estimated that it would cost approximately \$200 million to upgrade stormwater infrastructure throughout the city.

Councilman McCall spoke in favor of the increase, saying \$0.50 is a reasonable increase and contributes to the purpose of the fee. Other municipalities are doubling their stormwater fees and Florence has not had an increase since its inception in 2006. The problem will continue to get worse if it is not addressed. He acknowledged that the increase will not fix everything, but it allows more projects to be completed.

Mayor Ervin asked for clarity on the motion before Council. Mr. Jim Peterson, City Attorney, approached the podium and said there was a motion and a second on the original budget ordinance as presented. Then, there was a motion and a second to amend the budget ordinance. Once discussion is over on the amendment, Council will vote on the amendment. If the amendment passes, Council will then vote on the budget ordinance, as amended. Mr. Peterson said there is a complication. The portion of the amendment that deals with the increase in fee in Section 12-272(a)(2) of city code is not currently an item before Council. He further said the two amendments need to have two separate motions. Council can consider amending the budget ordinance on second reading today, but they cannot make an amendment to city code with only one reading. The amendment to city code can be considered for a first reading today, with second reading occurring on a later date. Mr. Peterson said the motion to amend Section 1(d) of the budget ordinance is on the table. Once that is addressed, Council can then make a motion to have first reading to amend Section 12-272(a)(2) of City Code to increase the stormwater fee.

Councilwoman Barnes inquired on the stormwater comprehensive study. Mr. Peterson said staff has already indicated they are moving forward with the study and the first year of it is already included in the budget. No action today will affect the study.

Councilwoman Moore asked if they are voting on an increase in fees. Mr. Peterson replied yes and no. The motion on the table is to amend the budget ordinance to increase the stormwater enterprise fund to \$1,663,000; however, in order to have a balanced budget, an increase in the stormwater fee will need to occur to increase the fund. Councilwoman Moore asked how many years it will be before another list of projects will come before Council. Mr. Randy Osterman, City Manager, said it will depend on the results of the comprehensive study. The study will identify the future needs and ways to fund the needs into the future. Councilwoman Moore asked how long the study will take, to which Mr. Osterman replied three years. He said the list of projects that were proposed to Council were identified by engineering staff as the worst.

Mayor Ervin asked Mr. Osterman if it is correct that when this bill was originally presented, Council could authorize a \$4 million bond for stormwater projects and could come back at a later time to complete the additional projects with another bond. Mr. Osterman said that is correct. He said Council could elect to do the \$4 million worth of projects now and another bond could be issued once the results of the study came back.

Pro tem Jebaily said the question before Council is the budget ordinance, and asked Mr. Yokim if the bond is imbedded within the ordinance. Mr. Yokim replied the original budget ordinance before Council includes a stormwater utility enterprise fund of \$1,460,500 that includes approximately \$325,000 of annual debt service on a \$4 million bond. The amendment on the floor would raise the annual debt service to approximately \$525,000, allowing the city to issue a \$7 million bond. In order to finance the additional debt service, the stormwater fee would need to increase by \$0.50 per month. Pro tem Jebaily said the city has been applying for grants to potentially fund infrastructure improvements. He asked what happens under the circumstance the city receives grant funding and how will it affect the project list, and have additional projects already been identified. Mr. Yokim replied the city's bond attorney, Mr. Charlton deSassure, proposed an amendment to the project description within the bond ordinance. The amendment to the project description does not limit projects the city can complete to those outlined on the list, allowing flexibility. Mr. Peterson said if the city receives grants for projects on the list, it will free up money for the city to complete additional projects staff has identified.

Councilwoman Moore said she wants citizens to know that projects will still be completed without the increase. Also, the grants the city received will also be used to complete additional projects. She asked Mr. Osterman to read the list of projects that will be completed without an increase. Mr. Osterman replied the Cheves Street Underpass, Malden Drive, Dargan and Elm Street, Cannon Street Outfall, Pennsylvania Street Outfall, St Anthony/College Park, Waccamaw Drive and Rutledge Avenue, and the Thomas Road Outfall.

Councilman Braddock asked Mr. Osterman to read the list of projects that will not be completed if the fee is not increased. Mr. Osterman said Oakland Avenue, Sandhurst West, Rebecca Street Outfall, and Wisteria.

Pro tem Jebaily said he has concerns with raising fees at this time, even though \$0.50 is not a significant amount. He said he is leaning towards approving the increase because he knows the city is applying for grants and the bond does not limit the scope of work to the project list. If the city is successful in getting the grant money, it will free up money for other projects that have been identified and move them further up the timetable.

Councilman Schofield said infrastructure drives the economy and allows for businesses to come into Florence and the city needs to address the problem now before it becomes a bigger issue. He said they

cannot continue to argue over pennies on a dollar when there are residents that cannot wait three or fifteen years for improvements.

Mayor Ervin summarized the options before Council. She said they can go ahead and proceed with the \$4 million bond as outlined from the last meeting and wait for the results from the study, or they can elect to amend the budget ordinance which will in effect necessitate an increase in the fee. She said either choice will not resolve all the drainage issues in Florence, it will simply start a process.

Mr. Yokim provided a reminder on the debt service millage. In August of 2020, City Council passed a General Obligation Bond Ordinance to construct the two new fire stations and for the purchase of equipment. After consulting with the bond attorney, the city's debt service millage will increase from 2.7 to 4 mils, a 1.3 mil increase.

Mayor Ervin said Councilman Schofield will need to amend his motion in order for them to be taken up separately. Councilman Schofield made a motion to amend Section 1(d) of Bill No. 2021-19 to increase the budget for the stormwater utility enterprise fund to \$1,663,000 and Councilwoman Barnes seconded the motion. Council voted 5-2 in favor of the amendment, with Mayor Ervin and Councilwoman Moore voting nay.

Council voted 5-2 to adopt Bill No. 2021-19, as amended, with Mayor Ervin and Councilwoman Mcore voting Nay.

Councilman Schofield made a motion to amend Section 12-272(a)(2) of the City of Florence, SC Code of Ordinances to increase the stormwater fee for each residential unit by \$0.50 per month to \$3.84 per month on first reading and Councilman Braddock seconded the motion. Mr. Peterson said this is first reading before Council.

Council voted 5-2 to pass an amendment to Section 12-272(a)(2) of the City of Florence, SC Code of Ordinances to increase the stormwater fee for each residential unit by \$0.50 per month to \$3.84 per month on first reading, with Mayor Ervin and Councilwoman Moore voting nay.

Bill No. 2021-20 - Second Reading

A second supplemental Ordinance providing for the issuance and sale of City of Florence, South Carolina, stormwater system revenue bonds, Series 2021, in the principal amount of not exceeding \$7,000,000; and other matters relating thereto.

Pro tem Jebaily made a motion to adopt Bill No. 2021-20 on second reading and Councilman McCall seconded the motion.

Mayor Ervin made a motion to amend Bill No. 2021-20 to substitute Exhibit "A" of the ordinance for the following language: Description of Project – "The Project consists of the construction, repair and renovation of the Stormwater Management System of the City as determined by City Council and City Staff." Councilwoman Moore seconded the motion to amend, which passed unanimously.

Council voted unanimously (7-0) to adopt Bill No. 2021-20, as amended.



EXHIBIT A

DIVISION 3. Aesthetics Advisory Committee

Sec. 2-133. Establishment, functions, and role.

- (a) *Establishment.* The City hereby establishes the Aesthetics Advisory Committee for the purposes set forth below.
- (b) Vision. The city will offer and support a quality of life for its citizens by emphasizing and encouraging its citizens to organize, mobilize, and energize to improve and enhance Florence communities by facilitating the development of an ideal environment, where sections, neighborhoods, streets, and blocks are made beautiful, safe, and inviting.
- (c) Mission statement. The Aesthetics Advisory Committee will work with and through the Community Redevelopment Committee of Council and the city manager to research, investigate, recommend, and support a culture of stewardship, striving to develop and enhance an aesthetic environment where every neighborhood will be a place that is attractive and inviting, a culture that extols the virtue of unity and beauty in community, and emphasize the value of standing strong together to alleviate disparities and build a healthy community. This committee will seek to address these issues in our community by promoting responsible practices to include, but not be limited to, programs and initiatives, education, and development.
- (d) Purpose, Duties, and Responsibilities. To advise city council by working with and through the Community Redevelopment Committee of Council and the city manager on the development of programs and initiatives, to facilitate the implementation of bridge building beautification projects that will connect and involve all in the community. To accomplish its purpose, the committee shall seek to accomplish the following:

Establish, document, and maintain short-term and long-term goals;

Provide advisement in the planning, development, implementation, and assessment of projects;

Promote the importance of community development through education, advocacy, and coordination;

Foster partnerships between governmental agencies, private community development groups, related organizations, and other community development and leadership professionals;

Support the City in seeking internal and external resources (such as grants and incentive opportunities) to support the implementation of the City's community development goals;

Embrace "Helping Florence Flourish" through the implementation of bridge building beautification projects that will connect and involve all in the community;

Develop an aesthetic environment where every neighborhood will be a place that is attractive and inviting;

Create a culture that extols the virtue of unity and beauty in community; and

Emphasize the value of standing strong together to alleviate disparities and build a healthy community.

Sec. 2-134. Membership.

- (a) *Committee size.* The Aesthetics Advisory Committee shall be comprised of seven (7) voting members appointed by city council.
- (b) Membership. Members must reside or be employed within the city limits. If a member moves out of the city or if the location of the member's employment is no longer within the city, the member shall no longer qualify for membership.

- (c) Terms.
 - (1) All terms of appointment to the advisory committee shall be three (3) consecutive years staggered so that two (2) or three (3) of the members have terms expiring in each year. Members shall serve until their successors are appointed and qualified.
 - (2) Provided, however, the terms of the initial appointees shall be staggered so that two (2) of the appointees shall serve initial terms of one (1) year, two (2) of the appointees shall serve initial terms of two (2) years, and three (3) of the appointees shall serve initial terms of three (3) years. After the completion of the initial terms, all members appointed shall serve three-year terms.
- (d) Officers. The officers of the Committee shall consist of a chairperson, a vice-chairperson, and a recording secretary.
 - (1) The initial chairperson shall be selected by city council and shall serve for two years. Following the initial term, the chairperson shall be selected by the advisory committee. The vice-chairperson and the recording secretary shall be elected by the advisory committee and shall serve for two years.
 - (2) Members shall serve on the advisory committee for at least one year before serving as officers on the advisory committee, absent extraordinary and extenuating circumstances. Officers shall be elected during the month of June, or as soon thereafter as feasible.
 - (3) The chairperson shall preserve order and decorum at all meetings while promoting discussion by all members in deliberations.
 - (4) In the chairperson's absence, the vice-chairperson shall serve as chairperson. In all other circumstances, the next senior member shall preside.
 - (5) The secretary shall keep notes during meetings and prepare minutes of meetings for approval by the committee at its next regular meeting. The secretary may also be a staff liaison and may designate one or more persons to assist in preparing and keeping minutes.
- (e) Ad hoc committees. With consent of the City Council, upon recommendation of the Community Redevelopment Committee of Council, the chairperson, in consultation with other officers, the entire committee, or both, shall have the right to form ad hoc committees to focus on particular projects. Each ad hoc committee shall be chaired by a member of the advisory committee and membership may include nonmembers selected by the committee.
- (e) Attendance requirements.
 - (1) Any member who, for reasons other than sickness or bona fide emergency, misses three consecutive regular meetings or 30 percent of all meetings within a calendar year shall no longer qualify for membership.
 - (2) Any member who is unable to attend a meeting, whether regular or special, shall contact the staff liaison as much in advance of the meeting as possible so that the staff liaison can determine and report to the chairperson whether or not a quorum can be established.
 - (3) The staff liaison shall maintain a record of attendance for each board member. The staff liaison shall be responsible for notifying the city clerk of any members who violate the attendance requirements. The city clerk shall then provide council with the details of the violation.
- (f) *Resignation*. Members shall provide resignation in writing to the city clerk's office with a copy to the advisory committee chairperson. The resignation shall state its effective date if different from the date tendered.
- (g) Ethics. All members shall be subject to the provisions of the South Carolina State Ethics Act.

Sec. 2-135. Quorum and voting procedures.

- (a) At least a majority of the duly appointed voting members must be present to conduct meetings and to vote.
- (b) All votes shall be decided by a simple majority of those present and voting.
- (c) A list of members and any votes taken shall accompany all advisory committee recommendations and resolutions or dissenting opinions.
- (d) Members present, including the chairperson, shall vote and shall not abstain, unless there is a conflict of interest.
- (e) In the instance of a conflict of interest, the conflict shall be stated for the record and a statement form completed.
- (f) Voting by proxy or absentee is prohibited.

Sec. 2-136. Meetings.

- (a) Meeting time and place. To the extent feasible, all meetings will be held on a weekday in city hall or at a meeting place and time of the advisory committee's choosing. At the committee's discretion, the chairperson or staff liaison shall schedule the time and place of meetings.
- (b) Meeting frequency. The committee shall hold regular meetings at a time and place to be appropriate by the committee. Other meetings may be called by the chairperson when deemed appropriate for conducting the business of the committee. The Resilience and Sustainability Advisory Committee shall meet a minimum of six times a year. Any ad hoc committees shall meet as deemed necessary by each ad hoc committee chairperson.
- (c) Rules of order. Meetings shall be conducted in an orderly manner to ensure the fair treatment of all persons and issues before the committee. One or more generally recognized publications on procedure shall be available for reference when procedural issues are to be resolved. The committee, in its discretion, may adopt its own rules of procedure.

Sec. 2-137. Staffing arrangements.

- (a) The city manager shall designate an employee to serve as a staff liaison. Specifically, it shall be the responsibility of the staff liaison to:
 - (1) Draft and mail agendas and information packets and arrange the time and place of meetings in consultation with the chairperson and vice-chairperson.
 - (2) Make available, in conjunction with the chairperson, relevant information and prepare all recommendations.
 - (3) Make available copies of comments, proposals or any other information submitted from other sources (i.e., neighborhood meetings, citizen organizations, departmental staff, appointed and elected officials) on a timely basis.
 - (4) Submit a calendar of events to each advisory committee member. Information on special meetings shall be submitted in addition to the planned calendar of events.
 - (5) Brief the city manager, or his designee, on the findings and activities of the committee using a status report at least once a year.
 - (6) Serve as a liaison between the city and other departments.
 - (7) Provide technical assistance to the advisory committee.

(b) The city manager shall, in coordination with department heads, assign additional staff as necessary to assist with ad hoc committees and coordinate initiatives with city staff.

Sec. 2-138. Staff reports and recommendations.

The staff liaison may submit reports and recommendations for those agenda items requiring decisions or recommendations by the committee. Other staff having experience, education, and professional training in the subject matter may provide input into the reports and recommendations or may provide supplemental ones. The material submitted may be oral, written, or graphic, or some combination of all. The reports and recommendations shall be accepted as evidence of record to the same extent as oral testimony and exhibits accepted from applicants, opponents, persons who are subjects of an inquiry, expert and lay witnesses, and members of the public who provide information for the record of the proceedings.

Sec. 2-139. Notice and public information.

- (a) The staff liaison shall be responsible for ensuring compliance with the Freedom of Information Act and for notifying the city clerk reasonably in advance of all meetings.
- (b) The staff liaison is required to comply with guidelines pertaining to matters of public notice and scheduling as provided by the city clerk.

DIVISION 3. Resilience & Sustainability Advisory Committee

Sec. 2-125. Definitions.

The following definitions shall apply to the terms below as they may appear throughout the bylaws:

Chapter 2 of the Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to establish the Public Safety Citizen's Review Board by adding Sections 2-140 through 2-146 to Division 3 thereof, said Code Sections to read in their entirety as set forth in Exhibit A hereto, which is specifically incorporated herein by reference.

2. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its approval and adoption on Second Reading.

DIVISION 3. Public Safety Citizen's Review Board

Sec. 2-140. Purpose.

- (a) The city council finds that the demands and challenges for uniformed employees serving in the public safety are different from those of employees serving in other city departments.
- (b) In certain circumstances, there is merit in having independent citizens of good character and good judgment make conclusions after reasonable inquiry about general departmental practices and specific events which are brought to their attention. This division establishes the mechanism by which such inquires can be made and such conclusions can be reached in a way that protects the public interest, public safety personnel and promotes the integrity of the city organization.
- (c) The city council further finds citizens and city officials will benefit from an independent board that is empowered to consider larger policy issues as they pertain to public safety departments and to hear specific concerns from the public at large concerning the departments when those concerns are significant enough to warranty scrutiny and independent judgment.

Sec. 2-141. Public Safety citizen's review board.

There is established a public safety citizen's review board to exercise the powers vested in it in accordance with the provisions of this division. The board shall receive and review internal complaints from uniformed employees about policies, practices and procedures in the public safety departments. The board shall also receive and review external complaints about uniformed employees of the public safety departments. Uniformed employees shall include all personnel who have been trained and certified in accordance with the general law of the state to exercise the authority of a public safety official regardless of whether they wear uniforms in the exercise of their duties on a regular basis.

Sec. 2-142. Members and terms of office; uniformed participants.

- (a) The board shall consist of seven voting members, selected by the city council for terms of office of four years each. Provided, however, the terms of the initial appointees shall be staggered so that seats designated as seats 1 and 2 will serve initial terms of two (2) years, seats designated as seats 3, 4, and 5 will serve initial terms of four (4) years, and seats designated as seats 6 and 7 will serve initial terms of three (3) years. After completion of the initial terms, all members of the board will serve four (4) year terms. Each member must be a person who resides in the city, is at least 21 years of age, and has sound judgment and good moral character. No member shall be the spouse, parent, child or sibling of any employee of a public safety department. Each board member must complete the Police Departments Citizens Police Academy and a curriculum for the purpose of becoming familiar with fire departmental operations and policies. The city council shall exercise care in its selection of members to maintain a total membership that is reasonably representative of a cross section of a diverse population.
- (b) In addition to the voting members, there shall be two nonvoting participant representatives of the uniformed employees from all public safety departments. Each participant shall be selected by the city manager after consultation with chief of each public safety department and other members of these departments as deemed appropriate by the city manager. Each participant shall have at least five continuous years' experience with the department and no participant shall be the grade of lieutenant or higher. Each nonvoting participant shall be authorized to volunteer statements or to answer questions from the board during hearings and deliberations. Nonvoting participants shall not vote on actions taken by the board. Each nonvoting member shall be subject to disciplinary action for violating committee provisions of confidentiality.

Sec. 2-143. Meetings.

The board shall establish a regular schedule for meetings that occur no less than four times each year on a quarterly basis. The committee shall also make provision for special meetings as special needs arise. At each regular meeting, citizens shall be afforded an opportunity to address the board on matters within the board's jurisdiction pursuant to such reasonable rules as the board may adopt to ensure a balance between good order and the rights of citizens to be heard. A majority of the duly appointed voting members shall constitute a quorum. A quorum shall be present before any business is conducted by the board other than rescheduling a meeting.

Sec. 2-144. Complaints.

- (a) Internal complaints.
 - (1) Any uniformed employee of a public safety department who believes that the policies and practices of that department result continually in acts of unfairness, or believes that on a single occasion, there has been an especially damaging impact, may file a written statement requesting the board to review those practices, or to address the circumstances of the single event The complaint must specify what actions the employee has taken to seek a redress of the issue internally and should say in what respects the department's internal procedures have not or will not address the problem.
 - (2) The following complaints in ordinary circumstances shall not be addressed to the board:
 - a. Annual employee evaluations.
 - b. Job assignments.
 - c. Amounts of compensation.
 - d. Disciplinary actions
 - (3) Notwithstanding the list of exclusions in subsection (a)(2) of this section, such items may be presented to the board for review when there is a compelling reason to do so and the employee describes succinctly how departmental procedures otherwise in place fail to properly evaluate the employee's circumstances.
- (b) External complaints. Any person who has a complaint about the conduct or statements of a uniformed employee of a public safety department may initiate a complaint with the department, through the human resources department or directly with the board. All external complaints, regardless of how received, shall first be investigated by the affected department and the complainant shall be informed of the final departmental determination. If the complainant is not satisfied with the determination, he or she may seek further review by the board in accordance with the procedure outlined in this division. All final departmental determinations must inform the complaining person of this opportunity.

Sec. 2-145. Powers of the commission board.

(a) Upon receipt of a complaint, the board has up to 30 days to determine the necessity of an investigation. The board may undertake an inquiry through its own membership, or through city staff from outside the public safety department, or through some combination of those resources to determine the accuracy of the facts and circumstances set forth in the complaint. Upon completion of the inquiry, the board shall summarize its findings and recommended actions and shall submit those to the complaining employee or to the complaining member of the public and shall submit the same findings and recommendations to the chief of the affected department and to the city manager. The chief and the city manager may designate one or more persons to receive and assess such reports and recommendations on a regular basis.

- (b) All hearings or meetings conducted by the board to address complaints are held in executive session unless the complaining party requests, at least 24 hours prior to the hearing, that it be held in open session. The official recording and the official minutes of all such hearings or meetings are subject to the control and disposition of the City Manager.
- (c) In exercising its duties under subsection (a) of this section, the board shall have access to personnel records or records related to personnel, except to the limited extent such access is specifically precluded by state or federal law, that pertain to the issue. Personnel records which are not relevant shall not be made available. The board shall have access to records and files kept in the ordinary course of departmental operations. The board shall have access to other investigations and inquires within the department and relevant to the inquiry before the board. Any assertion by a department head or a person keeping the records to be provided that their disclosure to the board would breach confidentiality of highly personal information, threaten public security, or harm an ongoing investigation shall be resolved by the city attorney.
- (d) The board shall not have the authority to summon for interview any city employee. Nor shall the elected officials of the city be subjected to a summons from the board. The board has authority to invite for interview any member of the public having knowledge of the facts. The conversations may be held in private to the full extent otherwise permitted by law. The board may delegate one or more members to conduct private interviews, provided their meetings and discussions occur in compliance with state law. The board or delegated board members may hold such conversations in private without notifying the chief of the affected department.
- (e) The board on its own may initiate its own inquiry into established practices of the department, or into the facts giving rise to a specific occurrence, provided the board first delivers to the city manager a written statement of its intent to do so. Upon completion of such inquiries, the board shall make a summary of its findings and present them along with any recommendations to the city manager.
- (f) The board may request legal advice from the city attorney. Such legal advice will be provided in executive session.
- (g) The board may, at times, request to speak with the city manager to discuss items of interest or concern related to the management or operations of the public safety department. The city manager shall inform the city council of the board's concerns.
- (h) Information which is lawfully classified as confidential and which is received as confidential information by the board shall not be disclosed, directly or indirectly, by board members to media representatives, other members of the public, or to employees. Failure to obey the confidentiality rules set forth herein is grounds for removal of a board member. Nothing in this subsection shall preclude the disclosure of all relevant information to the extent necessary or appropriate by the committee in its reports to the public safety chief and the city manager.

Sec. 2-146. Retaliation prohibited.

- (a) No supervisor or coworker of a complaining employee shall retaliate, directly or indirectly, in any manner against the employee who exercises rights under this division or who makes statements to the board or its delegated member or representative.
- (b) No uniformed employee of the public safety department shall retaliate, directly or indirectly, in any manner against any complaining person who is part of the general public for having submitted a complaint or report to the board.
- (c) Any violation of this section shall be a basis for disciplinary action, including dismissal.

AGENDA ITEM:

An ordinance to amend Section 12-272(a)(1) and (2) of Chapter 12, Article IV (Drainage and Stormwater Management) to add \$0.50 per equivalent residential unit to the rate charged for the stormwater utility service charges.

DEPARTMENT/DIVISION: Finance

I. ISSUE UNDER CONSIDERATION:

For City Council consideration is an ordinance authorizing an increase of \$0.50 per equivalent residential unit to the stormwater utility service charges.

II. CURRENT STATUS/PREVIOUS ACTION TAKEN:

- 1. At its June 21, 2021 special called meeting, City Council amended at second reading Ordinance 2021-15 to increase the size of the stormwater bond being issued to \$7,000,000 from \$4,000,000.
- 2. In addition, also at its June 21, 2021 special called meeting, City Council approved a motion to increase the stormwater utility service charges by \$0.50 per month per equivalent residential unit in order to fund the debt service on this bond.
- 3. The City Attorney informed City Council that the motion to increase the stormwater utility service charges needed to be in the form of an ordinance and that this motion would be considered as the first reading of this ordinance.

III. POINTS TO CONSIDER:

- 1. Staff recommends adoption of the ordinance. Council has approved second reading of the ordinance to issue stormwater revenue bonds in an amount not to exceed \$7,000,000 at its June 21, 2021 special called meeting. The increase in the stormwater utility service charges is necessary to fund the debt service on these bonds.
- 2. Bids were received on the bonds on June 29, 2021 and the bonds are scheduled to close on July 22, 2021.
- 3. Due to the timing of this Council meeting and the sale of the bonds, this increase in the stormwater utility service charges will first appear on the utility bills that are due on September 15, 2021.

IV. STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends approval and adoption of the proposed ordinance to amend City Code in order to increase the stormwater utility service charges.

ORDINANCE NO. 2021-____

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 12-272(a)(1) AND (2) OF CHAPTER 12, ARTICLE IV (DRAINAGE AND STORMWATER MANAGEMENT) TO ADD \$0.50 PER EQUIVILENT RESIDENTIAL UNIT TO THE RATE CHARGED FOR THE STORMWATER UTILITY SERVICE CHARGES.

WHEREAS, the Stormwater Utility Funds raised by the Stormwater Utility Service Charges in the City do not raise sufficient funds to address the stormwater issues throughout the City; and

WHEREAS, we find and conclude that, even though the increase of \$0.50 per Equivalent Residential Unit (ERU) will certainly not be a large enough increase to address all of the stormwater issues, this small raise will allow the City to expand its response to stormwater issues in the interim while the conducting studies needed to try to address these issues more comprehensively; and

WHEREAS, the amendments contained herein will allow the City to increase the stormwater bond being issued presently from \$4,000,000 to \$7,000,000;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FLORENCE IN MEETING DULY ASSEMBLED, AND BY THE AUTHORITY THEREOF:

I. That the provisions of Section 12-272(a)(1) and (2) of the City Code of the City of Florence be, and the same are hereby, amended to read in whole as follows:

- (1) Detached single-family dwelling units. Detached single-family dwelling units, as defined in this article, shall be divided into four (4) classes of customers for billing purposes. All detached single-family dwelling units having one thousand five hundred (1,500) square feet of impervious area or less shall be billed for six tenths (0.6) of one (1) equivalent residential unit, as defined in this division. All detached single-family dwelling units having between one thousand five hundred and one (1,501) square feet of impervious area and five thousand (5,000) square feet of impervious area shall be billed for one (1) equivalent residential unit, as defined in this division. All detached single-family dwelling units having between five thousand and one (5,001) square feet of impervious area and seven thousand five hundred (7,500) square feet of impervious area shall be billed for tree (3) equivalent residential units, as defined in this division. The rate charged will be three dollars and eighty-four cents (\$3.84) per equivalent residential unit per month.
- (2) Other developed lands. All developed lands not classified as detached single-family dwelling units, as defined by this article, shall be billed for each two thousand five hundred (2,500) square

foot increment of impervious surfaces or partial increment thereof located on the property. The fee charged for each equivalent residential unit will be based on a declining block rate in accordance with the table below. The first twelve (12) equivalent residential units will be charged at a rate of three dollars and eighty-four cents (\$3.84) per equivalent residential unit per month. The next twenty-eight (28) equivalent residential units will be charged at a rate of three dollars and seven cents (\$3.07) per equivalent residential unit per month, and the additional equivalent residential units shall be charged pursuant to the schedule in the table below.

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





The United States Marshals Service is requesting the authorization from the City of Florence to designate the street parking around the McMillan Federal Building and Courthouse to be under the physical monitoring and control of this agency. This authorization from the city would allow the United States Marshals Service to secure the street parking in the immediate vicinity of the McMillan Federal Building on Evans, Sanborn, McQueen, and Barnes Street. This authorization would not supplant any enforcement authority granted to the Florence Police Department under state law over these parking areas or streets.

Our paramount motivation for this request is the overall safety of the citizenry of Florence that utilize the services of the federal courthouse and the protection of the federal judiciary housed there. This authorization would allow this agency to place signage indicating that the parking in front of the McMillan Building on Evans Street is "U. S. Marshals Parking Only". Additionally, "No Parking" signs would be placed around the perimeter of the McMillan Building on Sanborn, McQueen, and Barnes Street.

The McMillan Federal Building and Courthouse has the highest level of security classification of any facility in eastern South Carolina. It serves as a federal courthouse that holds two sitting federal district court judges, two visiting federal district court judges, two federal magistrates, and the administrative judge of the Social Security Administration. The McMillan Building serves as the center of federal judicial administration for the Pee Dee and Grand Strand regions

of South Carolina. It houses law enforcement components and prosecutorial offices of the United States Department of Justice that conduct sensitive investigations throughout the area.


The administration of justice in this courthouse involves extremely sensitive high-threat trials. The streetscape project is a wonderful beautification project undertaken by the City of Florence; however, these enhancements create unique security obstacles for this courthouse. The new parking in front of the McMillan Building created by the streetscape project is a huge security concern for this building. The addition of the streetscape parking creates a natural avenue for vehicle-borne explosives to be more easily placed next to the federal courthouse. It also provides easy access for outside elements to park, surveil, and threaten jurors and witnesses as they enter the building. Any of the potential scenarios would have an adverse impact upon the administration of justice and hamper the enforcement of our nation's laws.


The McMillan Federal Building provides ample parking behind our facility for use by the general public during regular business hours. It is accessible every day to the public. It is secure, maintained, and monitored for safety by the Marshals Service. We encourage everyone to utilize it when conducting business at the McMillan Federal Building and Courthouse. The parking is compliant for handicap visitors. In summary, the City of Florence's consideration for this request authorization is greatly appreciated by the United States Marshals Service. APPROVING THE ISSUANCE BY THE HOUSING AUTHORITY OF THE CITY OF FLORENCE OF ITS MULTIFAMILY HOUSING REVENUE BONDS (DILLON GRADE SCHOOL APARTMENTS), AS REQUIRED BY SECTION 147(f) OF THE INTERNAL REVENUE CODE, IN THE AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF NOT TO EXCEED \$8,000,000.

WHEREAS, the Housing Authority of the City of Florence, South Carolina (the "Housing Authority"), has been requested by Dillon School Senior, LP, a South Carolina limited partnership (the "Applicant"), to assist the Applicant in providing financing for a portion of the costs of acquisition of an approximately 5.6 acre parcel of land and the existing improvements thereon located at 301 Martin Luther King, Jr. Boulevard (the "Site") in the City of Dillon, South Carolina and constructing, renovating such improvements, and adapting for reuse for 37 affordable residential units for elderly persons, including amenities functionally related and subordinate thereto, and a portion of the costs of financing (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Housing Authority adopted an Inducement Resolution on February 19, 2021, providing that in the event the Applicant meets the requirements set forth in the Inducement Resolution, the Housing Authority will undertake to issue its multifamily housing revenue bonds or notes (the "*Bonds*") under the provisions of Title 31, Chapter 13 of the Code of Laws of South Carolina 1976, as amended (the "*Act*"), particularly Sections 31-13-90 and 31-13-190 thereof, and Sections 31-3-20(15) and (17) and 31-3-540 of the Code of Laws of South Carolina 1976, as amended (the "*Code*"), in the amount necessary to fund one or more mortgage loans to the Applicant in an amount of not to exceed \$8,000,000 to provide funds for the acquisition, rehabilitation, and conversion of the Project to affordable senior rental housing; and

WHEREAS, Sections 31-3-400 and 31-3-410 of the Code authorize a housing authority to exercise any or all of its powers within the territorial boundaries of any other municipality if resolutions are adopted (a) by the council of such municipality in which the housing authority proposes to exercise its powers and (b) by the housing authority of such municipality, if any, declaring that there is a need for the housing authority to exercise its powers within such municipality; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Dillon (the "Dillon City Council") has not created a municipal housing authority within the City of Dillon; and

WHERAS, by resolution duly adopted on April 12, 2021, the Dillon City Council gave its approval authorizing the Housing Authority to issue its Bonds to finance a portion of the costs of the Project; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has been further advised that the Applicant intends to borrow the proceeds derived from the sale of the Bonds and undertake the Project such that the interest on the Bonds will be excluded from gross income for federal income tax purposes under Sections 103 and 142 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "*Tax Code*"), if certain procedural steps are taken with respect to the approval of the Bonds, to qualify the Project for federal and South Carolina low income housing tax credits, thereby reducing the costs of acquiring and converting the Project to affordable housing which will result in lower rents than would otherwise be necessary to charge the tenants in the Project; and

WHEREAS, Section 147(f) of the Tax Code provides that the Bonds may not be issued as taxexempt bonds under the Tax Code unless the issue of Bonds has been approved by the next higher governmental body (i) with elected members and (ii) from which the authority of the Housing Authority is derived; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Florence (the "City Council") is the elected legislative body of the next higher governmental body with elected members and from which the authority of the Housing Authority is derived, all within the meaning of Section 147(f) of the Tax Code; and

WHEREAS, the Housing Authority has further advised City Council that one of the requirements of the Tax Code is that a public hearing must take place before approval by the elected legislative body under Section 147(f) of the Tax Code; and

WHEREAS, the City Council held a public hearing immediately prior to the meeting at which this Resolution is being considered, duly noticed by publication of a notice of public hearing not less than _____(__) days prior to the date of the public hearing in [Newspaper], a newspaper published in the City of Florence, at which all residents of the City of Florence and other interested persons were given a reasonable opportunity to express their views; and

WHEREAS, upon consideration of the Housing Authority's requests, the City Council has determined to support the Project by approving the proposal of the Housing Authority to issue the Bonds to finance a portion of the costs of the Project;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Florence, South Carolina, as follows:

<u>SECTION 1</u>. The City Council hereby approves, within the meaning of Section 147(f) of the Tax Code, the issuance of the Bonds as qualified exempt facility bonds for qualified residential rental projects under Section 142(a)(7) of the Tax Code, to finance a portion of the costs of the Project.

SECTION 2. The Bonds will be payable by the Housing Authority solely and exclusively out of payments to be made by the Applicant with respect to the Project. The Bonds will not constitute a debt or grant or loan of the credit of the City of Florence (the "*City*"), the Housing Authority, the State of South Carolina (the "*State*"), or any other political subdivision of the State within the meaning of any State constitutional provision or statutory limitation or other applicable authority, nor give rise to a pecuniary liability of the City, the Housing Authority, or the State. The Bonds will not constitute a charge against the general credit of the City, the Housing Authority, or the State or the taxing powers of either the City or the State. Neither the State nor the City shall be liable on the Bonds.

<u>SECTION 3</u>. All resolutions and parts thereof in conflict herewith are to the extent of such conflict hereby repealed, and this resolution shall take effect and be in full force and effect from and after its adoption.
