MEMBERS PRESENT: Mayor Pro tem Frank J. Brand called the regular meeting to order at 1:00 p.m. with the following members present: Councilman Robby L. Hill; Councilwoman Teresa Myers Ervin; Councilman Ed Robinson; and Councilman Glynn F. Willis.

APPEARANCES BEFORE COUNCIL

MR. RICHARD MOSES AND MR. WES SANDIFER – THE BENEFIT BANK OF SOUTH CAROLINA

Mr. Richard Moses, Regional Coordinator for the Pee Dee Area Benefit Bank of South Carolina appeared before Council and gave a brief overview of the services they offer.

Benefit Bank of South Carolina is a non-profit organization where low and moderate income families and individuals can ask for help in completing applications for Medicaid, food stamps, TANF (Temporary Assistance for Needy Families), Voter Registration, and filing federal and state tax returns.

Mr. Wes Sandifer added that TBBSC is also working with technical colleges throughout the state and helping with filling out FAFSA applications.

The goal of TBBSC is to take individuals and families from a crisis situation to self-sustainability.

MRS. BECKY ELLIOTT AND MR. STEPHEN GUYTON

Mr. Stephen Guyton and Mrs. Becky Elliott presented the official City of Florence Christmas Ornament to Mayor Pro tem Brand. The 2013 ornament depicts the Florence County Museum and is the 20th and final ornament in the series.

PRESENTATION OF THE CITY OF FLORENCE, SC COMPREHENSIVE ANNUAL FINANCIAL REPORT AND AUDITED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS BY THE INDEPENDENT CERTIFIED PUBLIC ACCOUNTING FIRM OF WEBSTER ROGERS LLP

Mr. Gregory Ackerman with Webster Rogers LLP gave an overview of the annual financial report and the audited financial statements for the year ending June 30, 2013. They have issued an unqualified opinion on the financial statements as a whole. An unqualified opinion is the highest level of assurance that a CPA firm can provide. It basically means it is a clean opinion and no instances were found of items that needed to be reported, any misstatements that were considered to be material or any items that needed to be brought to the attention of those charged with governance (Council).

The following information highlights the most significant changes in the City's financial position over the last year.

- The assets of the City of Florence exceeded its liabilities at the close of the most recent fiscal year by \$154,233,070 (net position). Of this amount, \$36,523,016 (unrestricted net position) may be used to meet the government's ongoing obligations to citizens and creditors.
- The government's total net position increased by \$11,845,173 during the fiscal year ended June 30, 2013, with a \$2,432,751 increase resulting from governmental activities and a 9,412,422 increase resulting from business-type activities.

- As of the close of the current fiscal year, the City of Florence's governmental funds reported a combined ending fund balances of \$14,062,746, an increase of \$1,334,351 in comparison with the prior year. Approximately 60.0 percent of this total amount, \$8,415,209 is available for spending at the government's discretion (unassigned fund balance).
- At the end of the current fiscal year, unassigned fund balance for the general fund was \$8,415,209, or 24 percent of the total general fund expenditures.
- The City of Florence had \$136.7 million in bonds and notes outstanding versus \$140.6 million last year, a decrease of 2.8 percent.

The main significant action in the General Fund for the current year vs. other years was the capital lease for the City Center building. The City administration offices moved from the City County Complex to the City Center building. That transaction included the funding that was provided by the Drs. Bruce and Lee Foundation for the renovations.

Mayor Pro tem Brand thanked Mr. Ackerman for his report.

An Ordinance to declare as surplus parcels containing approximately 10 acres and designated as Tax Map numbers: 90085-10-001, 90085-11-003, 90085-11-002, 90085-10-004, 90085-10-002, 90085-10-005, 90085-09-001, 99086-04-010, 90086-04-012, 90086-04-008, 90086-04-011, 90086-04-015, 90085-10-003, and 90085-09-002 in the records of the Florence County Tax Assessor and authorize the transfer of same parcels was adopted on second reading.

Councilman Hill made a motion to adopt Bill No. 2013-26 on second reading. Councilwoman Ervin seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

INTRODUCTION OF ORDINANCES

BILL NO. 2013-20 - FIRST READING

AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE BUSINESES BY ENACTING A NEW CHAPTER IN THE CITY OF FLORENCE CODE OF ORDINANCES TO ESTABLISH PROVISION AND REQUIREMENTS FOR THE SCREENING OF CRIMINAL RECORDS BY EMPLOYERS WITHIN THE CITY OF FLORENCE.

This item has been deferred until the January 13, 2014 City Council meeting.

BILL NO. 2013-27 - FIRST READING

AN ORDINANCE TO DECLARE AS SURPLUS A PARCEL CONTAINING APPROXIMATELY 0.13 ACRES AND DESIGNATED AS TAX MAP NUMBER 90055-07-002 IN THE RECORDS OF THE FLORENCE COUNTY TAX ASSESSOR.

An Ordinance to declare as surplus a parcel containing approximately 0.13 acres and designated as Tax Map Number 90055-07-002 in the records of the Florence County Tax Assessor was passed on first reading.

Mr. Phillip Lookadoo, Director of Planning, Research and Development reported this parcel was acquired a number of years ago with the City's purchase of the Brookgreen Water System. The parcel is of limited use to the City of Florence, therefore staff is recommending the adoption of the proposed Ordinance that would declare the parcel as surplus. This action would make the parcel available for transfer to the adjoining land owner who is interested in purchasing the parcel.

For clarification, Mr. Drew Griffin, City Manager added that the Ordinance states that the parcel would be sold at tax book value. This eliminates the cost of having an appraisal conducted and other activities associated with selling the parcel.

Councilman Willis made a motion to adopt Bill No. 2013-27 on second reading. Councilwoman Ervin seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

BILL NO. 2013-28 - FIRST READING

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND PLANNED DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT ORDINANCE 2008-02 PERMITTED USES AND SITE PLAN.

An Ordinance to amend Planned Development District Ordinance 2008-02 Permitted Uses and Site Plan was passed on first reading.

Mr. Phillip Lookadoo, Director of Planning, Research and Development reported that in January 2008, City Council adopted an Ordinance that rezoned lots owned by New Ebenezer Baptist Church from B-3, General Commercial District and R-4, Multi-Family Residential Limited District to Planned Development District (PDD). The only permitted uses within the Ordinance were a church and a daycare. In January 2013, a zoning permit was issued for a recreational center on the lot to the East of the church. The church would like to amend PDD Ordinance 2008-02 to allow a school that serves kindergarten through fourth grade within the recreational center. The request is to also amend the Ordinance site plan adding a circular driveway and 35' x 35' canopy for the recreational center.

Councilman Willis made a motion to pass Bill No. 2013-28 on first reading. Councilwoman Ervin seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

BILL NO. 2013-29 - FIRST READING

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE BUDGET FOR THE CITY OF FLORENCE, SOUTH CAROLINA, FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JULY 1, 2013, AND ENDING JUNE 30, 2014.

An Ordinance to amend the budget for the City of Florence, South Carolina, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2014 was passed on first reading.

Mr. Thomas Chandler, Director of Finance reported that the proposed Ordinance provides for funds to be re-appropriated from fiscal year 2012-13 to 2013-14 in the General Fund, the Water and Sewer Enterprise Fund, the Hospitality Fund, the Water & Sewer Equipment Replacement Fund and the Stormwater Equipment Replacement Fund to complete projects and purchases which were not finalized at the end of fiscal year 2012-13.

Funds are also being re-appropriated from fiscal year 2012-13 to 2013-14 in the General Fund and the Water and Sewer Enterprise Fund to provide for remaining costs related to moving City administrative and operational departments into the City Center facility located at 324 W. Evans Street to serve as City Hall.

Additionally, the General Fund budget is being amended to provide for insurance proceeds received for a sanitation truck that was destroyed by fire and for proceeds anticipated to be received from the sale of a fire department mini-pumper. Proceeds from this sale will be used to upgrade an existing heavy duty pickup truck.

Councilman Willis made a motion to pass Bill No. 2013-29 on first reading. Councilwoman Ervin seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTIONS

RESOLUTION NO. 2013-28

A RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF THE START SMART READINESS INITIATIVE.

A Resolution in support of the Start Smart Readiness Initiative was adopted by Council.

Mrs. Debbie Hyler of the School Foundation and Dr. Floyd Creech, Director of School Readiness, appeared before Council and gave a report on the Start Smart Initiative. The goal of the program is to have all children in Florence County to be ready for Kindergarten. The research is very clear that if children enter Kindergarten at the appropriate level of readiness then they are more likely to succeed in third grade, which means they will be more likely to graduate from high school and become productive citizens.

Councilman Willis made a motion to adopt Resolution No. 2013-28. Councilwoman Ervin seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

MEMBERS PRESENT: Mayor Wukela called the special meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. with the following members present: Mayor Pro tem Brand; Councilwoman Octavia Williams-Blake; Councilman Ed Robinson; and Councilman Glynn F. Willis.

Notice of the date, time and location of the meeting was provided to the media and those individuals requesting copies of the City Council agenda.

Mr. Ken Baker from WMBF and Mr. Gavin Jackson from the Morning News were present for the meeting.

INVOCATION

Councilman Willis gave the invocation for the meeting. The Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag followed.

INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTION

RESOLUTION NO. 2013-30

A RESOLUTION WAIVING THE APPEAL TO CITY COUNCIL FROM THE DESIGN REVIEW BOARD REQUIRED BY SECTION 2.9-10(A) OF THE ZONING ORDINANCE FOR DRB MATTER NUMBER 2013-33 WHICH RELATES TO THE APPLICATION BY THE CITY FOR A CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATENESS TO ALLOW DEMOLITION OF THE TRUST BUILDING BECAUSE OF THE OBVIOUS CONFLICT OF INTEREST CREATED BY CITY COUNCIL SERVING AS AN APPELLATE BODY FOR ITS OWN APPLICATION.

A Resolution waiving the appeal to City Council from the Design Review Board required by Section 2.9-10(A) of the Zoning Ordinance for DRB Matter Number 2013-33 which relates to the application by the City for a Certificate of Appropriateness to allow demolition of the Trust Building because of the obvious conflict of interest created by City Council serving as an appellate body for its own application was adopted by Council.

Mayor Wukela stated that in September, 2013 this Council voted to move forward with the project of obtaining the parcels including and immediately surrounding the Trust Building,

demolishing those parcels and conveying them to Francis Marion University for the purposes of the construction of a health sciences facility downtown. That action was followed by the Historical Commission Stay of Demolition permit for 60 days. That was at the end of October, so that stay is either up or about up. That was followed by, as required by our ordinance, an application by the City to the City's Design Review Board for a Certificate of Appropriateness for demolition. That board conducted a hearing on December 11, 2013 and received voluminous testimony and information, including two engineering reports provided by the City indicating that the building was not feasible for repurpose economically. Also there was the testimony of different developers who have tried to accomplish that goal unsuccessfully, as well as cost estimates. At the conclusion of that meeting the Design Review Board voted 6-1 to issue a Certificate of Appropriateness and that was followed by an order. Under the City Ordinance the next appeal would be 30 days by any party that had standing to this City Council. Our Counsel has advised us, as well as independent Counsel that was hired from the Municipal Association to represent the Design Review Board at that meeting, that there is a clear conflict of interest in the City sitting as a judge in its own cause in an appeal. A recommendation has been made for the City to waive that appeal and instead direct anyone that has standing to appeal directly to the Circuit Court. It is not appropriate for the City Council to stand in judgment of its own cause. Resolution No. 2013-30 would waive the appeal to City Council and direct anyone that has standing to appeal directly to the Circuit Court within 30 days of the Design Review Board's decision.

Mayor Pro tem Brand made a motion to adopt Resolution No. 2013-30. Councilman Willis seconded the motion.

Mr. Jim Peterson, City Attorney, explained in order to file an appeal to Circuit Court; the individual would file the appeal action with the County Clerk of Court at the County Complex.

Following a discussion, Councilman Robinson stated he would like to file an objection based on the fact that the entire Council was not involved in authorizing City Staff to obtain a contract on the Trust Building and stated he feels the contract is not legal.

Councilman Robinson also protested the meeting when Council approved the contract for the Trust Building stating that the meeting time was changed without the full involvement of City Council.

Councilman Robinson's last protest relates to the Design Review Board's public hearing that was held on December 11, 2013. Councilman Robinson stated that a member of the board was denied due process during that meeting.

Voting aye to adopt Resolution No. 2013-30 was Mayor Wukela, Mayor Pro tem Brand, Councilman Willis and Councilwoman Williams-Blake.

Voting no was Councilman Robinson.

Following a brief discussion, it was determined that any appeal in DRB Matter Number 2013-33 must be filed within 30 days after a person with substantial interest in the decision of

the Design Review Board receives actual notice of the decision of the Design Review Board. In addition, the 30 day period will begin to run no sooner than the date of Resolution Number 2013-30 which is December 20, 2013.

Councilman Robinson made a motion to amend Resolution No. 2013-30 to state that a person will have within 30 days to file an appeal after they receive actual notice of the decision of the Design Review Board. Councilwoman Williams-Blake seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

RESOLUTION OF APPRECIATION - BISHOP CHARLES O. MCDOWELL

A Resolution of Appreciation for Bishop Charles O. McDowell was adopted by Council. Councilwoman Williams-Blake stated this is a Resolution of Appreciation to express condolences on the death of Bishop Charles McDowell. Bishop McDowell served as a pastor in a church that was located in the City of Florence for over 30 years.

Mayor Pro tem Brand made a motion to approve the Resolution. Councilman Willis seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

Request to amend Planned Development District Ordinance 2008-02 permitted uses and site plan.



II. CURRENT STATUS/PREVIOUS ACTION TAKEN

No previous action has been taken on this ordinance.

III. POINTS TO CONSIDER

The objective of the proposed ordinance is to more closely align budgeted amounts with actual revenues and expenditures thereby eliminating or reducing significant variances between budgeted and actual amounts in both revenue and expenditure categories. Funds are being reappropriated from fiscal year 2012-13 to 2013-14 in the General Fund, the Water & Sewer Utilities Enterprise Fund, the Hospitality Fund, the Water & Sewer Equipment Replacement Fund and the Stormwater Equipment Replacement Fund to complete projects and purchases which were not finalized at the end of fiscal year 2012-13.

Funds are also being re-appropriated from fiscal year 2012-13 to 2013-14 in the General Fund and Water and Sewer Enterprise Fund to provide for remaining costs related to moving City administrative and operational departments into the City Center facility located at 324 W. Evans Street to serve as City Hall. These costs are being paid for from remaining grant funding in the General Fund and from unappropriated reserves of both the General Fund and the Water and Sewer Enterprise Fund.

Additionally, the General Fund budget is being amended to provide for insurance proceeds received for a sanitation truck that was destroyed by fire, and for proceeds anticipated to be received from the sale of a fire department mini-pumper. Proceeds from the sale of the mini-pumper will be used to upgrade an existing heavy duty pickup truck for use as a brush truck to fight grass and brush fires.

This Ordinance, which is patterned after an Ordinance enacted by the City of Philadelphia, PA, would result in the City establishing regulations which limit the obtaining and use of information regarding arrests and convictions in the employment process in an effort to make sure that such information is not improperly used by the City or employers within the City to accomplish the following goals:

a. To assist the successful reintegration of formerly-incarcerated people back into the community by removing barriers to gainful employment after their release from jail/prison;

b. To enhance the health and security of the community by assisting people with criminal/arrest records to provide for their families and themselves; and

c. To ensure that, within the City of Florence, just and fair measures are implemented and practiced when screening and identifying persons who may or may not have criminal records.

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AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE BUSINESSES BY ENACTING A NEW CHAPTER IN THE CITY OF FLORENCE CODE OF ORDINANCES TO ESTABLISH PROVISIONS AND REQUIREMENTS FOR THE SCREENING OF CRIMINAL RECORDS BY EMPLOYERS WITHIN THE CITY OF FLORENCE.

WHEREAS, the Council of the City of Florence, South Carolina, hereby finds and determines:

- Persons with criminal records suffer from pervasive discrimination in many areas of life employment housing, education, and eligibility for many forms of social benefits: and
- b. As of 2000, more than 70 million people nationwide had criminal records and are reported to experience lifelong discrimination because of their past convictions, and Florence has a high corrections population because of their past convictions:, and
- c. As of 2000 there have been approximately 35,000 arrest within the city of Florence of which approximately 60% are because recidivism: and
- d. The percentage of people of color arrested and convicted both local and nationwide exceed the percentage of their representation in the population as a whole, which disproportionately impacts their lives, families and communities; and
- e. Criminal background checks by employers have increased at a record rate, with a vast majority of employers in the U.S. now screening their workers for criminal records; and
- f. Formerly-incarcerated people represents a group of job-seekers, ready to contribute and add to the work force; and
- Lack of employment is a significant cause of recidivism; people who employed are significantly less likely to be re-arrested; and
- h. Obstacles to employment for people with criminal records and other barriers to re-entry are creating permanent members of an underclass that threatens the health of the community and undermines public safety.

- i. This Legislation concerns a sensitive and highly controversial subject, and should not be construed to require an employer to hire someone with a criminal record, nor to limit an employer's ability to choose the most qualified and appropriate application for the employment opportunity at hand.
- j. This legislation is intended to give the individual with a criminal/arrest record an opportunity to be judged on his or her own merit during the submission of the application and at least until the completion of one interview.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FLORENCE, SOUTH CAROLINA, IN MEETING DULY ASSEMBLED, AND BY THE AUTHORITY THEREOF THAT CHAPTER 13 OF THE CITY CODE IS HEREBY AMENDED TO ADD A NEW ARTICLE IX WHICH SHALL READ IN ITS ENTIRETY AS FOLLOWS:

Article IX Limitations on Inquiry Concerning Criminal Record During The Employment Process

Sec. 13-140 It is the intent and purpose of this Chapter:

- To assist the successful reintegration of formerly-incarcerated people back into the community by removing barriers to gainful employment after their release from jail/prison;
- b. To enhance the health and security of the community by assisting people with criminal/arrest records to provide for their families and themselves; and
- c. To ensure that, within the City of Florence, just and fair measures are implemented and practiced when screening and identifying persons who may or may not have criminal records.

Sec. 13-141 Definitions.

As used in this Chapter this Chapter the following terms have the following meanings:

a. "Applicant" means any person considered or who requests to be considered for employment by an employer

- b. "City agency" means the city, or any City department, agency, board or commission.
- c. "Conviction" shall mean any sentence arising from a verdict or plea of guilty or nolo contendere, including a sentence of incarceration, a suspended sentence, a sentence of probation or a sentence of unconditional discharge.
- d. "Employment" means any occupation, vocation, job, work for pay or employment, including temporary or seasonal work, contracted work, contingent work and work through the services of a temporary or other employment agency; or any form of vocational or educational training with or without pay. "Employment" shall not, for the purpose of this Chapter, include membership in any law enforcement agency.
- e. "Inquiry" means any direct or indirect conduct intended to gather information, using any mode of communication.
- f. "Interview' means any direct contact by the employer with the applicant, weather in person or by telephone, to discuss the employment being sought or the applicant's qualifications.
- g. "Criminal Justice Agency" means any, court including the minor judiciary, with criminal jurisdiction or any other governmental agency, or subunit thereof, created by statute or by the state or Federal constitutions, specifically authorized to perform as its principal function the administration of criminal justice, and which allocates a substantial portion of its annual budget to such function; and agencies whose principal function relates to the administration of criminal justice, including but not limited to organized State and municipal police departments, local detention facilities, correctional facilities, probation agencies, district or prosecuting attorneys, parole boards, pardon boards and public agencies that provide care, guidance and control to adjudicated delinquents.

- h. "License" means any certificate, license, permit, authorization or grant of permission required by the City as a condition for the lawful practice of any occupation, employment, trade, vocation, business, or profession. "License" shall not for the purpose of this Chapter, include any license, authorization or permit to own, possess, carry, or fire any explosive, pistol, handgun, rifle, shotgun, or other firearm.
- i. "Private employer" means any person, company, corporation, labor organization or association which employs ten or more persons within the City of Florence. It includes job placement and referral agencies and other employment agencies.

Sec. 13-142 Prohibition Against Unfair Discrimination Against Persons Previously Arrested For One Or More Criminal Offenses.

a. In connection with the licensing or employment of any person, it shall be an unlawful discriminatory practice of a City agency or private employer to knowingly and intentionally make any inquiry about or to take any adverse action against any person on the basis of any arrest or criminal accusation made against such person, which is not then pending against that person and which did not result in a conviction. It shall further be an unlawful discriminatory practice for a City agency or private employer to require any person to disclose or reveal any arrest or criminal accusation made against such person which is not then pending against that person and which did not result in a conviction.

Sec.13-143 Prohibition Against Unfair Discrimination Against Persons Previously Convicted For One Or More Criminal Offenses.

a. In connection with licensing or employment of any person, it shall be an unlawful discriminatory practice for a City agency or private employer to make any inquiry regarding or to require any person to disclose or reveal any criminal convictions during the application process. The application process shall begin when the applicant inquires about

the employment bent sought and shall end when an employer has accepted an employment application.

b. It shall further be an unlawful discriminatory practice for a City agency or private employer to make any inquiry regarding, or to require any person to disclose or reveal any criminal convictions against such person before and during the first interview. If an employer does not conduct an interview, that employer is prohibited from making any inquires or gathering any information regarding the applicant's criminal convictions. If the applicant voluntarily discloses any information regarding his or her criminal conviction at the interview, the employer may discuss the criminal conviction disclosed by the applicant.

Sec. 13-144 Exemptions.

- a. The prohibitions of this Chapter shall not apply if the inquires or adverse actions prohibited herein are specifically authorized by any other applicable law.
- b. The prohibitions of this Chapter shall not apply to a Criminal Justice Agency as defined herein.
- c. Nothing in this Chapter shall modify or waive the requirements and limitations on the use of criminal records in Florence.

Sec. 13-145 Enforcement.

- a. The City Manager shall designate the appropriate city department to administer and enforce this Chapter.
- b. Each violation of this Chapter shall constitute a "Class III" offense and any person who violates this Chapter shall be subject to a fine as set forth under "Class III" offenses.

Sec. 13-146 Fair Criminal Record Screening Advisory Screening Advisory Committee.

- a. Establishment. The City Council hereby calls upon the City Manager to establish a nine (9) person committee entitled the "The Criminal Record Screening Advisory Committee" the purpose of which shall be to review the implementation and effectiveness of this Chapter and to make recommendations to the City Council regarding this Chapter.
- b. Members. The Committee shall be composed of nine (9) members, one (1) each by each Council member, one (1) by the City Manager, and of the eight shall appoint one (1) other to be Chairperson. The appointees shall consist of: two (2) that have arrest/criminal records, two (2) form the business community, two (2) from general public, one (1) minister, and the other two, shall be the committee appointee and City Manager's appointee, no restrictions
- c. Meetings: The committee shall meet at least quarterly. All meetings shall be open to the public and will allow for public testimony on policies or conduct relating to this Chapter.

Sec. 13-147 Severability.

If any section, subsection, subdivision, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance, or the application of such provision to any person or circumstance, is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such a decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance, or the application of such provision to persons or circumstances other than those as to which it is held invalid. The City Council hereby declares that it would have passed each section, subsection, subdivision, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance irrespective of the unconstitutionality of invalidity of any section, subsection, subdivision, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase.

Sec. 13-148 Effective Date.

After its approval and adoption on by City Council with two readings, this Ordinance shall become effective on January 1, 2014.

I. ISSUE UNDER CONSIDERATION:

The applicant requests the City of Florence abandon its interest in a ten foot right-of-way originally serving as an alley connecting the 400 block of Poplar Street with the 400 block of Spruce Street. (See Attachment 1).

II. POINTS TO CONSIDER:

- (1) Notifications, which included information regarding the consideration of abandonment as well as location maps of the right-of-way, were sent to each of the property owners as well as the current residents of each dwelling unit adjacent to the alley.
- (2) Notice was given in the Morning News on December 23, 24, and 25, 2013 as required by Section 2-28 of the City of Florence Code of Ordinances.
- (3) The following City of Florence departments were contacted regarding the abandonment of the right-of-way: Fire; Police; Public Works; Utilities; Engineering; and Planning, Research, and Development. None of the aforementioned departments found any reason to maintain the City's interest in this alley.
- (4) During staff's investigation, it was found that the property owner of 416 Spruce Street uses the right-of-way as access to the rear of their property (Attachment 2)
- (5) It was also found that the portion of the right-of-way running behind the houses on Spruce and Poplar Streets (alley running parallel to Spruce and Poplar Streets) is cluttered with various fences, buildings, and vegetation, making it impassible.
- (6) The portion of the right-of-way leading off of Poplar Street is obstructed by trees and other vegetation (Attachment 3).
- (7) Based on an actual road-course simulating the 90 degree turn on the 10 ft right-of-way, it is not feasible to navigate a modern vehicle through the entirety of the alley (Attachment 4).
- (8) Planning Commission unanimously recommended abandonment of a portion of the aforementioned right-of-way (See Attachment 5 identifying recommended abandonment.)
- (9) If City Council approves the abandonment of interest in this right-of-way, homeowners adjacent to the right-of-way may, through the completion of a

the plat approval process and recording of a quitclaim deed, add an additional five feet of the adjacent right-of way, running the distance of their property boundaries, onto their property (Attachment 5).

III. CURRENT STATUS/PREVIOUS ACTION TAKEN:

Planning Commission held a public hearing on November 12, 2013 regarding this matter. The Planning Commission voted unanimously to recommend abandonment of a portion of the 10 foot right-of-way that runs between Poplar Street and Spruce Street (See Attachment 5). Since 416 Spruce Street continues to utilize the alley for access to the rear of their property, Planning Commission recommended that the City not abandon its interest in the portion leading perpendicularly off of Spruce Street which runs to the rear of tax map parcel 90076-02-017 (416 Spruce St.). (See Attachment 5 identifying recommended abandonment.)

IV. OPTIONS

City Council may:

- (1) Approve the request as presented based on the information submitted.
- (2) Defer the request should additional information be needed.
- (3) Suggest other alternatives.
- (4) Deny the request.






