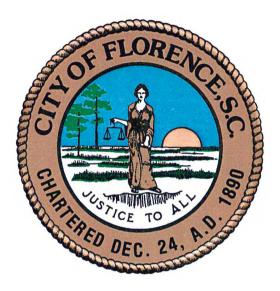

REGULAR MEETING OF FLORENCE CITY COUNCIL MONDAY, NOVEMBER 14, 2016 – 1:00 P.M. CITY CENTER – COUNCIL CHAMBERS 324 W. EVANS STREET FLORENCE, SOUTH CAROLINA

<u>CALL TO ORDER</u>: Mayor Stephen J. Wukela called the regular meeting to order at 1:03 p.m. with the following members present: Mayor Pro tem Frank J. "Buddy" Brand; Councilman Robby L. Hill; Councilwoman Teresa Myers Ervin; Councilwoman Octavia Williams-Blake; and Councilman George D. Jebaily.

MEMBER ABSENT: Councilwoman Pat Gibson-Hye Moore was absent.

ALSO PRESENT: Drew Griffin, City Manager; Dianne M. Rowan, Municipal Clerk; James W. Peterson, Jr., City Attorney; Michael Hemingway, Director of Utilities; Chuck Pope, Director of Public Works; Ray Reich, Downtown Development Manager; Chief Randy Osterman, Florence Fire Department; Chief Allen Heidler, Florence Police Department; Jerry Dudley, Planning Manager, Planning, Research and Development; Thomas Chandler, Director of Finance and Scotty Davis, Director of Community Services.

Notices of the regularly scheduled City Council meeting were sent to the media and persons requesting a copy of the agenda, informing them of the date, time and location of the meeting.

Mr. Josh Lloyd of the Morning News was present for the meeting.

INVOCATION

Councilwoman Teresa Myers Ervin gave the invocation for the meeting. The Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag followed.

COUNCILMAN ROBBY HILL

Mayor Wukela recognized Councilman Robby Hill and thanked him for his four years of service on Florence City Council.

Councilman Hill spoke about his experiences over the past four years while serving on City Council and thanked the City of Florence and the citizens for the opportunity to serve. Councilman Hill thanked each member of Council, the City Manager and City Staff for their help in making the last four years a success.

COUNCILMAN GEORGE JEBAILY

Councilman Jebaily brought to Council's attention the passing of Mr. Fred K. Samra on November 4, 2016. Mr. Samra was a life long resident of Florence, owned a business in downtown for many years, and was a past member of Florence City Council. Mr. Samra was involved in the very early stages of the redevelopment of downtown during the 1980's and was an avid supporter of the redevelopment initiative and efforts.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Mayor Pro tem Brand made a motion to approve the minutes of the September 12, 2016 Regular Meeting and the minutes of the October 14, 2016 Special Meeting. Councilman Hill seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

HONORS AND RECOGNITIONS

RETIREMENT RECOGNITION

Mayor Wukela presented Major Carlos Raines a Retirement Plaque in honor of his retirement from the City of Florence. Major Raines began working with the City on July 5, 1973 with the Florence Police Department and retired on August 9, 2016 after serving 43 years.

SERVICE RECOGNITIONS

Mayor Wukela presented Gloria Howard a Certificate of Recognition for completing 30 years of service with the City of Florence Police Department.

Brandin Robinson received a Certificate of Recognition for completing 10 years of service with the City of Florence.

APPEARANCE BEFORE COUNCIL

MS. BUQUILLA CANNON, DIRECTOR OF NORTH FLORENCE COMMUNITY HERITAGE AND HISTORY ORGANIZATION – TO REQUEST COUNCIL TO DESIGNATE THE 200 AND 300 BLOCKS OF NORTH DARGAN STREET AS THE AFRICAN AMERICAN HISTORICAL BUSINESS DISTRICT.

Ms. Buquilla Cannon, Director of the North Florence Community Heritage and History Organization appeared before Council and requested that the 200 and 300 blocks of North Dargan Street be named the African American Historical District.

Ms. Cannon previously made a request through the Florence Historical Commission in 2014 to have this designation made. Ms. Cannon has met several times with the Chairperson of the Historical Commission regarding the application since 2014; however no progress has been made on the application.

Ms. Cannon asked Council what could be done to see that this designation become a reality. Mr. Drew Griffin, City Manager stated that a meeting will be set up with Ms. Cannon and the City Planning Department in order to move forward with the request.

MS. MADIE ROBINSON, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF PEE DEE HEALTHY START – A PRESENTATION ON THE DANNON PROJECT – RE-ENTRY DEMONSTRATION.

At the request of Ms. Robinson this item will be deferred until the January, 2017 City Council meeting.

ORDINANCES IN POSITION

BILL NO. 2016-34 - SECOND READING

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE CITY TO LEASE THE REAL ESTATE KNOWN AS 228A WEST DARLINGTON STREET AND DESIGNATED AS TAX PARCEL 90086-02-004 IN THE RECORDS OF THE FLORENCE COUNTY TAX ASSESSOR TO PEE DEE REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY UNDER THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS SET OUT IN THE WRITTEN LEASE ATTACHED AS EXHIBIT A TO THIS ORDINANCE.

An Ordinance authorizing the City to lease the real estate known as 228A West Darlington Street and designated as Tax Parcel 90086-02-004 in the records of the Florence County Tax Assessor to Pee Dee Regional Transportation Authority under the terms and conditions set out in the written lease attached as Exhibit A to this Ordinance was discussed in Executive Session.

Council deferred action on this matter until after Executive Session.

Following a discussion held in Executive Session, Mayor Pro tem Brand made a motion to adopt Bill No. 2016-34 on second reading. Councilman Hill seconded the motion.

Council voted unanimously to adopt Bill No. 2016-34 on second reading.

<u>BILL NO. 2016-38 – SECOND READING</u> <u>AN ORDINANCE TO ANNEX AND ZONE PROPERTY OWNED BY CAROLYN D. GRIFFIN</u> LOCATED AT 2525 HOFFMEYER ROAD, A PORTION OF TMN 01221-01-105.

An Ordinance to annex and zone property owned by Carolyn D. Griffin located at 2525 Hoffmeyer Road, a portion of TMN 01221-01-105 was adopted on second reading.

Mayor Pro tem Brand made a motion to adopt Bill No. 2016-38 on second reading. Councilman Hill seconded the motion.

Mr. Jerry Dudley, Planning Manager reported Parcel 01221-01-105 was zoned and annexed into the City in July of 2004; however the small 0.153 acre portion that connects the lot to West Andover Road was recently combined with the parcel. This new portion of the lot is not within the City limits and the owner wishes to annex the portion so that the entirety of the lot is annexed and zoned.

The lot is currently vacant. City water and sewer services are currently available and there is no cost to extend utility services.

City staff recommends annexation and concurs with the Planning Commission's recommendations to zone the property R-1, Single-Family Residential District.

Bill No. 2016-38 was adopted on second reading by a unanimous vote.

BILL NO. 2016-39 - SECOND READING

AN ORDINANCE TO ANNEX AND ZONE PROPERTY OWNED BY LINDA D. SEGARS AND LOCATED AT 2688 TROTTER ROAD, TMN 00984-01-013.

An Ordinance to annex and zone property owned by Linda D. Segars and located at 2688 Trotter Road, TMN 00984-01-013 was adopted on second reading.

Mayor Pro tem Brand made a motion to adopt Bill No. 2016-39 on second reading. Councilwoman Octavia Williams-Blake seconded the motion.

Mr. Jerry Dudley, Planning Manager reported the lot is currently the site of a single-family dwelling with city water and sewer services currently available.

City staff recommends annexation and concurs with the Planning Commission's recommendation to zone the property R-1, Single-Family Residential District.

City Council voted unanimously to adopt Bill No. 2016-39 on second reading.

BILL NO. 2016-40 - SECOND READING

AN ORDINANCE TO ANNEX AND ZONE PROPERTY OWNED BY THE CITY OF FLORENCE AND LOCATED ON THE SOUTHWEST CORNER OF SUMTER AND ALEXANDER STREETS, TMN 90060-08-008.

An Ordinance to annex and zone property owned by the City of Florence and located on the southwest corner of Sumter and Alexander Streets, TMN 90060-08-008 was adopted on second reading.

Mayor Pro tem Brand made a motion to adopt Bill No. 2016-40 on second reading. Councilwoman Ervin seconded the motion.

Mr. Jerry Dudley, Planning Manager reported this is a parcel of land that is owned by the City of Florence and is proposed to be a part of the Neighborhood Revitalization project. The proposal is to zone the parcel R-3, Single-Family Residential District. Six single family homes are proposed for the property.

City water and sewer services are currently available and there is no cost to extend utility services.

City staff recommends annexation and concurs with the Planning Commission's recommendation to zone the property R-3, Single-Family Residential District and apply the Neighborhood Revitalization Overlay District as it will allow the development of the property as part of the City's Neighborhood Revitalization Plan.

City Council voted unanimously to adopt Bill No. 2016-40 on second reading.

<u>BILL NO. 2016-41 – SECOND READING</u> <u>AN ORDINANCE TO ANNEX AND ZONE PROPERTY LOCATED ON THIRD LOOP ROAD</u> AND ENCHANTED LANE, TMN's 90032-05-001, 004, 008, 011 and 012.

An Ordinance to annex and zone property located on Third Loop Road and Enchanted Lane, TMN's 90032-05-001, 004, 008, 011 and 012 was adopted on second reading.

Councilman Hill made a motion to adopt Bill No. 2016-41 on second reading. Councilman Jebaily seconded the motion.

Councilwoman Williams-Blake recused herself from the discussion and voting regarding this matter.

Mr. Jerry Dudley, Planning Manager reported these are five adjacent parcels along Enchanted Lane and Third Loop Road. The parcels are proposed for annexation and zoning. City water service is currently available; however, sewer service is currently unavailable. The applicant has agreed to sufficiently fund the sewer extension project such that it is financially feasible for the City.

City staff recommends annexation as it promotes infill development and the developer is providing funds to make the extension of sewer financially feasible. In addition, city staff concurs with the Planning Commission's recommendation to zone the property R-2, Single-Family Residential District.

The motion to adopt Bill No. 2016-41 carried unanimously.

(Councilwoman Williams-Blake abstained from voting due to a potential conflict of interest).

INTRODUCTION OF ORDINANCES

BILL NO. 2016-42 – FIRST READING AN ORDINANCE TO DECLARE AS SURPLUS AND AUTHORIZE THE TRANSFER OF LAND TO BALLENGER, BARTH & LEWIS, LLP, SPECIFICALLY A PORTION OF TAX PARCEL 90086-02-004.

An Ordinance to declare as surplus and authorize the transfer of land to Ballenger, Barth & Lewis, LLP, specifically a portion of Tax Parcel 90086-02-004 was deferred for the purpose of discussing the matter in Executive Session.

After a discussion held in Executive Session, Councilman Hill made a motion to pass Bill No. 2016-42 on first reading. Mayor Pro tem Brand seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

BILL NO. 2016-43 - FIRST READING

AN ORDINANCE TO ANNEX AND ZONE PROPERTY OWNED BY FAMON V. AND NATALIE H. WHITFIELD, LOCATED AT 2667 ASCOT ROAD, TMN 00098-01-073.

An Ordinance to annex and zone property owned by Famon V. and Natalie H. Whitfield, located at 2667 Ascot Road, TMN 00098-01-073 was passed on first reading.

Mayor Pro tem Brand made a motion to pass Bill No. 2016-43 on first reading. Councilwoman Williams-Blake seconded the motion.

Mr. Jerry Dudley, Planning Manager reported this is the site of a single family dwelling located in the Grove Park/Windsor Forest area.

City water and sewer services are available and there is no cost to extend utility services.

City staff recommends annexation and concurs with the Planning Commission's recommendation to zone the property R-1, Single-Family Residential District.

City Council voted unanimously to pass Bill No. 2016-42 on first reading.

BILL NO. 2016-44 - FIRST READING

AN ORDINANCE TO REZONE TAX MAP NUMBERS 90030-01-002, 90030-02-001, AND 90030-02-009, LOCATED ON ROSEDALE STREET, FROM PLANNED DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT TO R-3, SINGLE-FAMILY RESIDENTIAL.

An Ordinance to rezone Tax Map Numbers 90030-01-002, 90030-02-001, and 90030-02-009, located on Rosedale Street, from Planned Development District to R-3, Single-Family Residential was passed on first reading.

Mayor Pro tem Brand made a motion to pass Bill No. 2016-44 on first reading. Councilman Hill seconded the motion.

Mr. Jerry Dudley, Planning Manager reported these three parcels are currently zoned Planned Development and were a part of the original Hampton Park Planned Development. In the original Planned Development the lots were set aside for single family development or townhome development.

The developer is proposing to rezone the properties to R-3, Single Family Residential which is very similar to what was currently allowed under the Planned Development and build single family detached homes in this area. The property is currently vacant.

City Staff recommends the parcels be zoned R-3, Single Family Residential District as requested. Bill No. 2016-44 was passed unanimously on first reading

BILL NO. 2016-45 - FIRST READING

AN ORDINANCE TO REZONE TAX MAP NUMBER 00126-01-209 AND A PORTION OF TAX MAP NUMBER 00126-01-395, LOCATED ON ALLIGATOR ROAD, FROM R-1, SINGLE-FAMILY RESIDENTIAL TO R-3, SINGLE-FAMILY RESIDENTIAL.

An Ordinance to rezone Tax Map Number 00126-01-209 and a portion of Tax Map Number 00126-01-395, located on Alligator Road, from R-1, Single-Family Residential to R-3, Single Family Residential was passed on first reading.

Mayor Pro tem Brand made a motion to pass Bill No. 2016-45 on first reading. Councilman Hill seconded the motion.

Mr. Jerry Dudley, Planning Manager reported to Council that the properties are currently vacant and a residential subdivision is planned for the properties. The properties are currently zoned R-1, Single-Family Residential with parcel 00126-01-395 having frontage along Alligator Road zoned B-3, General Commercial. The proposed zoning would change the R-1 zoning to R-3, Single-Family Residential and the current B-3 zoning on the portion of parcel 00126-01-395 would remain.

The R-1 zoning was applied to the parcels on September 14, 2006; however, development never occurred. Adjacent neighborhoods have developed more intensely, consistent with the development standards of R-3 zoning. Water and sewer services are available and there is no cost to extend utility services.

City Staff recommends the parcels be zoned R-3, Single Family Residential District as requested. The R-3 zoning designation would be harmonious with the Comprehensive Plan as well as the adjacent developing parcels.

City Council voted unanimously to pass Bill No. 2016-45 on first reading.

<u>BILL NO. 2016-46 – FIRST READING</u> <u>AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND PLANNED DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT ORDINANCE 2009-23,</u> <u>MCLEOD REGIONAL MEDICAL CENTER.</u>

An Ordinance to amend Planned Development District Ordinance 2009-23, McLeod Regional Medical Center was passed on first reading.

Councilman Hill made a motion to pass Bill No. 2016-46 on first reading. Councilman Jebaily seconded the motion.

Mr. Jerry Dudley, Planning Manager reported this is an amendment to the McLeod Health Care Plan Development District.

The Planning Commission held a public hearing on November 8, 2016 regarding this matter and voted unanimously (8-0) to recommend the proposed amendment.

City Council approved an amendment to Ordinance 2009-23 in July of 2015 to allow building construction to include a medical office building, parking garage, and Emergency Department.

City Council approved an amendment to Ordinance 2009-23 in September of 2010 to allow the construction of an ICU tower and the connecting concourse (Ordinance 2010-24).

McLeod Regional Medical Center would like to amend PDD Ordinance 2009-23 to allow further expansion of the medical campus. The locations of the proposed changes include:

- Abandonment of the portion of Griffin Streets between Day Street and East
 - Cheves Street;
- b. Jarrott Street Modifications;
- c. Abandonment of the portion of McFarland Street between East Cheves Street and East Palmetto Street;
- d. Demolition of Stokes building and parking lot modifications;
- e. John Street Extension from East Cheves Street to East Palmetto Street; and
- f. Entry features to be installed at the John Street, Jarrott Street, and East Cheves Street entrances to the campus.

Also, as a part of this proposed Planned Development amendment, McLeod Regional Medical Center is proposing to amend the signage plan to accommodate campus wayfinding.

City Council voted unanimously to pass Bill No. 2016-46 on first reading.

Mayor Pro tem Brand, Councilwoman Williams-Blake and Councilwoman Ervin abstained from discussion and voting on this matter due to a potential conflict of interest.

The recusal of the three members of Council does not affect the quorum of Council.

Voting in favor of passing Bill No. 2016-46 on first reading were Mayor Wukela, Councilman Jebaily and Councilman Hill.

BILL NO. 2016-47 - FIRST READING

a.

AN ORDINANCE TO ABANDON INTEREST OF THE CITY OF FLORENCE IN RIGHTS-OF-WAY TO INCLUDE THE SECTION OF NORTH GRIFFIN STREET AND SOUTH GRIFFIN STREET BOUNDED ON THE SOUTH BY EAST CHEVES STREET AND ON THE NORTH BY DAY STREET.

An Ordinance to abandon interest of the City of Florence in rights-of-way to include the section of North Griffin Street and South Griffin Street bounded by East Cheves Street and on the north by Day Street was passed on first reading.

Councilman Jebaily made a motion to pass Bill No. 2016-47 on first reading. Councilman Hill seconded the motion.

On July 15, 2015 City Council approved a Planned Development Amendment which included a proposed relocation and expansion of the McLeod Healthcare Emergency Department (Ordinance 2015-21).

McLeod Regional Healthcare has plans to relocate and expand the Emergency Department which will include about 50,000 square feet of space that will abut the Pavilion Tower and extend to the eastern curb of Griffin Street.

The abandonment and combination of the parcels and rights-of-way will allow the construction of the proposed Emergency Department.

Voting in favor of passing Bill No. 2016-47 on first reading were Mayor Wukela, Councilman Jebaily and Councilman Hill.

Mayor Pro tem Brand, Councilwoman Williams-Blake and Councilwoman Ervin recused themselves from discussion and voting regarding Bill No. 2016-47 due to a potential conflict of interest.

The quorum of Council was not affected by these recusals.

INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTIONS

RESOLUTION NO. 2016-23

A RESOLUTION APPROVING EXISTING MULTI-JURISDICTIONAL AGREEMENTS ENTERED INTO BY THE FLORENCE POLICE DEPARTMENT WITH SURROUNDING LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES.

A Resolution approving existing multi-jurisdictional agreements entered into by the Florence Police Department with surrounding law enforcement agencies was adopted by Council.

Councilman Hill made a motion to adopt Resolution No. 2016-23. Councilman Jebaily seconded the motion.

In the spring of 2012 City Council received a report regarding the need to coordinate the council approval of all multi-jurisdictional agreements with other law enforcement agencies in order to meet the requirements discussed in a recent decision of the Supreme Court of South Carolina. Council directed staff and the City Attorney to draft form agreements and Resolutions and to coordinate with the other entities to insure that these agreements have been properly authorized. This was accomplished with the adoption of Resolution No. 2013-02.

Mr. Jim Peterson, City Attorney reported at the conclusion of the 2016 Legislative Session in Columbia, SC, the legislature adopted Bill No. 222 which amended Chapter 20 of Title 23 of the SC Code of Laws. While this amendment did not change the law applicable to the process required for the City Police Department to enter into to multi-jurisdictional agreements with other law enforcement agencies, it did repeal several code sections which were specifically referenced in Resolution No. 2013-02, thus bringing about the need to amend that Resolution to reference the correct SC Code sections.

Due to the recent changes to Chapter 20 of Title 23 of the SC Code of Laws, Resolution No. 2016-23 is needed in order for the multi-jurisdictional law enforcement agreements to be valid.

These agreements allow and specify the process the Florence Police Department uses in coordinating with, assisting, and receiving assistance from surrounding law enforcement agencies. The Police Department has approved all of the agreements and signed them; however Council's approval is needed in order to comply with pre-requisites set out by the SC Supreme Court.

Resolution No. 2016-23 also specifically authorizes the City Manager to approve future agreements as they become necessary without coming back to Council every time.

Council voted unanimously to adopt Resolution No. 2016-23.

<u>RESOLUTION NO. 2016-24</u> <u>A RESOLUTION APPROVING REDEVELOPMENT GRANTS IN THE DOWNTOWN H1</u> <u>OVERLAY DISTRICT.</u>

A Resolution approving Redevelopment Grants in the Downton H1 Overlay District was deferred in order to hold discussions on this matter in Executive Session.

The next matter for Council's consideration is Resolution No. 2016-27. Mayor Wukela stated the City has been approached by a development team that seeks to develop a brew pub at 121 and 123 North Dargan Street. In evaluating their development potential, City Staff investigated the cost benefit analysis relative to the amount of the investment, the revenues that are expected to be generated as a result of the investment, and the cost of the incentive itself. The total investment is approximately \$550,000 and the

total incentive is approximately \$180,000. This represents a cost benefit analysis that meets the City's standards in excess of 1.16.

Councilman Hill made a motion to adopt Resolution No. 2016-27. Councilwoman Williams-Blake seconded the motion.

Council voted unanimously to adopt Resolution No. 2016-27.

B. The audited financial statements continue to reflect a sound financial position by the City. For the fiscal year ending June 30, 2016, the City's General Fund balance has increased, and the net positions in both the Water and Sewer Combined Utilities and the Stormwater Utility Enterprise Funds have increased. The City has been fortunate over the past several years to experience financial stability while at the same time facing challenging economic conditions.

DEPARTMENT/DIVISION: Department of Planning, Research & Development

I. ISSUE UNDER CONSIDERATION:

Request to amend Planned Development District Ordinance 2009-23 site plan and signage plan.

II. CURRENT STATUS/PREVIOUS ACTION TAKEN:

- (1) Planning Commission held a public hearing on November 8, 2016 regarding this matter and voted unanimously (8-0) to recommend the proposed amendment.
- (2) City Council approved an amendment to Ordinance 2009-23 in July of 2015 to allow building construction to include a medical office building, parking garage, and Emergency Department.
- (3) City Council approved an amendment to Ordinance 2009-23 in September of 2010 to allow the construction of an ICU tower and the connecting concourse (Ordinance 2010-24).

III. POINTS TO CONSIDER

- (1) In September 2009, City Council adopted an ordinance that rezoned multiple lots owned by McLeod Regional Medical Center to Planned Development District (PDD).
- (2) This ordinance was accompanied by a site plan for the medical campus illustrating the development standards and types of uses allowed on the McLeod properties.
- (3) McLeod Regional Medical Center would like to amend PDD Ordinance 2009-23 to allow further expansion of the medical campus. McLeod Regional Medical Center has provided a site plan (Attachment 4) illustrating the locations of the proposed changes, which include:
 - a. Abandonment of the portion of Griffin Street between Day Street and East Cheves Street;
 - b. Jarrott Street Modifications;
 - c. Abandonment of the portion of McFarland Street between East Cheves Street and East Palmetto Street;
 - d. Demolition of Stokes Building and parking lot modification;
 - e. John Street Extension from East Cheves Street to East Palmetto Street;
 - f. Entry features to be installed at the John Street, Jarrott Street, and East Cheves Street entrances to the campus.
- (4) McLeod Regional Medical Center proposed to amend the signage plan to accommodate campus wayfinding. The City of Florence Zoning Ordinance Section 2.6-3, Development Standards (for a PD), states that "signage shall be in harmony and scale with and reflective of the proposed PD." The McLeod Healthcare Campus encompasses approximately 130 acres along the East Cheves, East Palmetto, and Day Street corridors and is defined by its large masonry structures, mature trees, and urban development. McLeod is proposing an update of existing campus signage to facilitate wayfinding.
 - a. The proposed signage update includes primary wayfinding signs along street frontage directing traffic to the various sections of campus. Five of these signs have been permitted as replacements for existing signage (A1, A2, A3, A5,and A7); however,

additional signs will be required for proper wayfinding. The attached signage plan illustrates the proposed location, style, and size of the proposed signs (Attachment 5). The signs are located at an interval of one per block or historical block within the campus.

- b. Internal to the campus and at the entrances to buildings and parking, secondary informational signs are proposed (see Attachment 6). The attached signage plan illustrates the proposed location, style, and size of the proposed signs (Attachment 5).
- (5) All other regulations would remain the same as stated in Ordinance 2009-23.

IV. OPTIONS

City Council may:

- (1) Approve the request as presented based on the information submitted.
- (2) Defer the request should additional information be needed.
- (3) Suggest other alternatives
- (4) Deny the request.

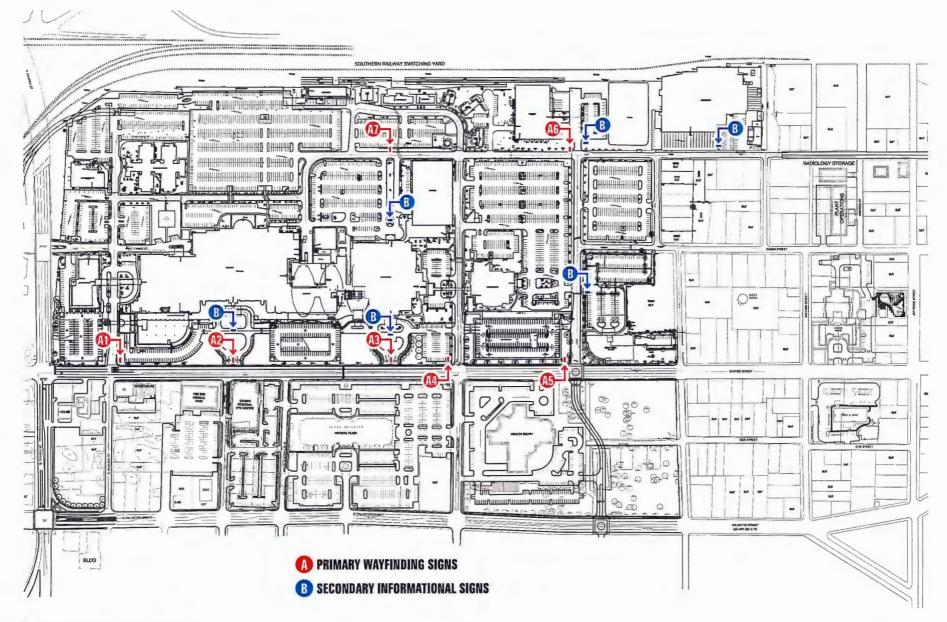

I. ISSUE UNDER CONSIDERATION:

- (5) If City Council approves the abandonment of interest in this right-of-way, the property can be combined into the adjacent parcels through the plat approval process and the recording of a quitclaim deed.

- (4) Deny the request.

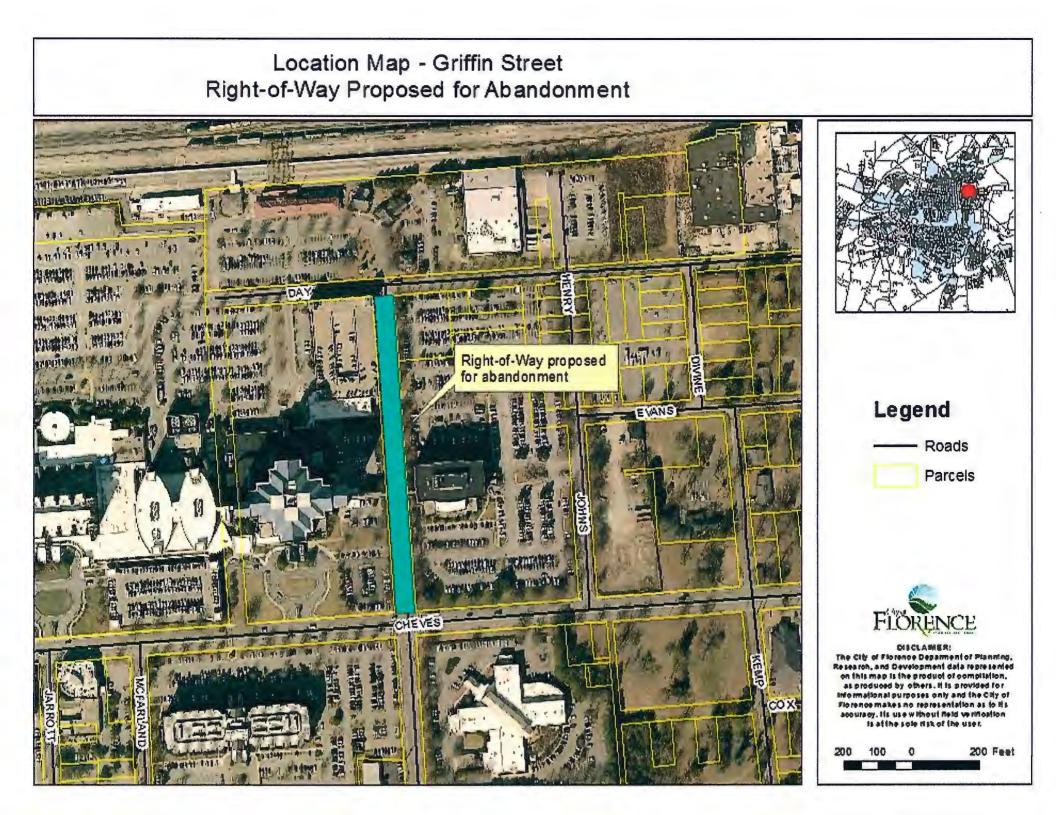

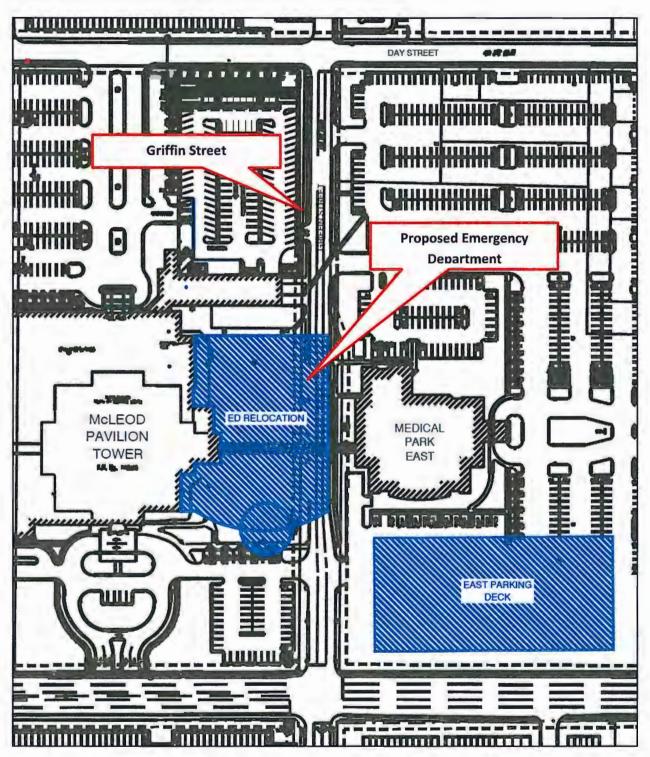

I. ISSUE UNDER CONSIDERATION

An amendment to the FY 2016-17 City of Florence Budget is presented to update the current year budget.

II. CURRENT STATUS/PREVIOUS ACTION TAKEN

No previous action has been taken on this ordinance.

III. POINTS TO CONSIDER

A. The objective of the proposed ordinance is to more closely align budgeted amounts with actual revenues and expenditures thereby eliminating or reducing significant variances between budgeted and actual amounts in both revenue and expenditure categories. Funds are being re-appropriated from fiscal year 2015-16 to 2016-17 in the General Fund, the Water & Sewer Utilities Enterprise Fund, the Hospitality Fund, and the Water & Sewer Equipment Replacement Fund to complete projects and purchases which were not finalized at the end of fiscal year 2015-16.

B. The General Fund Contingency budget is being amended to provide prorated funding for FY 2016-17 for the Building Inspections and Permits Department as well as funding for General Fund projects, programs, and requirements that have developed since the beginning of the fiscal year but were not incorporated in the original FY 2016-17 budget as adopted. These projects and requirements include Dargan Street Incubator operations costs, Cheves St. parking deck operations and maintenance costs, BTC parking lease payments, PDRTA downtown shuttle service, and public information communications services.

C. The FY 2016-17 Hospitality Fund budget is being amended to provide \$250,000 funding for Civic Center capital expansion and improvement costs from Unappropriated Reserve. Funding in the amount of \$250,000 will also be included in the FY 2017-18 Hospitality Fund budget to provide additional funding for a total of \$500,000 for the Civic Center expansion. The City and County are equally sharing the cost of \$1 million in capital improvements. This funding is in addition and supplemental to the funding approved by City Council in December 2015, to be equally shared with Florence County, for \$15 million in Civic Center expansion and improvements, financed through the issuance of Accommodations Fee Revenue Bonds of Florence County, Series 2015.

IV. STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Approve and adopt the proposed ordinance.

 - 40049900-598130 Civic Center (Hospitality Fund General Expenditures) is increased in the amount of \$250,000 to provide additional funding for Civic Center capital expansion and improvement costs. The City and County are equally sharing the cost of these additional capital improvements. Funding in the amount of \$250, 000 will also be included in the FY 2017-18 Hospitality Fund budget to provide an additional funding for a total of \$500,000 for the Civic Center expansion.
- **Section 9.** That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict or inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency or conflict.

This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its approval and adoption by the City Council of the City of Florence.

The deadline for receiving the Accommodations Tax applications for FY 2016-17 Accommodations Tax funding was July 22, 2016. In response to several requests, the City of Florence extended the deadline for submitting fiscal year 2016-2017 Accommodations Tax applications to Friday, September 2, 2016.

The Accommodations Tax Advisory Committee held meetings in August and September 2016 for the purpose of receiving and evaluating Accommodations Tax funding requests for fiscal year 2016-2017. Requests were received from twenty-eight (28) organizations requesting "65% funds" and one (1) organization requesting "30% funding.

The Committee has studied these requests carefully, examining closely the critical needs expressed by the representatives of the requesting agencies, and evaluating the impact these agencies have on the tourism in the Florence community.

Preliminary projections indicate that approximately \$505,000 of the "65% funds" will be available for allocation to requesting agencies and an additional \$209,000 for tourism promotion in the "30% funds."

The Accommodations Tax Advisory Committee is again recommending to City Council that the 2016-2017 appropriations to the various arts organizations be routed through the Florence Regional Arts Alliance to enable that organization to receive additional grant funding through the South Carolina Arts Commission. The Florence Regional Arts Alliance will then disburse the Accommodations Tax funds directly to the funded arts organizations in the amounts appropriated by City Council. This arrangement enables the Arts Alliance to substantially increase its level of grant funding from the South Carolina Arts Commission for its Small Grants Program which benefits a large number of arts organizations in the Florence area. The organizations/events which will be funded in this manner include: **The Masterworks Choir, Florence Little Theatre, Florence Symphony Orchestra, Arts International Festival, Sankofa Festival, SC Dance Theatre, Play Me I'm Yours Event, Lucky Shamrock Festival, and the Chili, Brews and BBQ Event in addition to the independent funding of the Florence Area Arts Alliance.**

Attached you will find the Accommodations Tax Requests for FY 2016-2017 report listing all organizations requesting funds for this year; the amount of funding received by these organizations for FY 2015-16; the amount of funds requested by the organizations for FY 2016-17; and the recommendations of the Advisory Committee (**Attachment 1**). You will also find attached an Accommodations Tax Financial Report for fiscal year ending June 30, 2016 (**Attachment 2**). In addition, an Accommodations Tax Projection of Receipts for FY 2016-17 is included for your information (**Attachment 3**). Also enclosed are copies of the initial public notice and the extended deadline public notice printed in the local newspaper providing information concerning application for Accommodations Tax Funding (**Attachment 4**).

I. ISSUE UNDER CONSIDERATION

Designation of a Banking Services Evaluation and Recommendation Committee to review the results of proposals requested from banks located within the City of Florence to provide the City's banking services for a five-year contract period.

II. CURRENT STATUS/PREVIOUS ACTION TAKEN

- A. The City of Florence contracts its banking services with a local bank selected through a request-forproposal (RFP) process.
- B. On December 12, 2012, City Council selected Wachovia Bank (currently Wells Fargo) to provide banking services to the City of Florence.
- C. This selection was based on the recommendation of an Evaluation Committee composed of three members of City Council appointed by the Mayor.
- D. The present contract with Well Fargo expires on January 31, 2017.

III. POINTS TO CONSIDER

- A. On October 25, 2016 Requests for Proposals were submitted to banks located within the Florence city limits to provide the City's banking services for a five-year contract period beginning February 1, 2017 and ending January 31, 2022.
- B. The deadline for submitting these proposals was November 28, 2016. Timely proposals were received from First Citizens Bank, PNC, TD Bank and Wells Fargo.
- C. Criteria used in analyzing the proposals will include, but may not be limited to, customer accessibility, total bank deposits within the City, experience/governmental references, Community Reinvestment Act (CRA) performance/rating, average annual interest rate, monthly service fees, and earnings credit rate.
- D. The process for selection has in the past included a recommendation to City Council by the Evaluation and Recommendation Committee to approve a proposing bank that, in the committee's determination, best meets the needs of the City consistent with, but not limited to the following: a fair and reasonable fee structure, reputation of the institution, technological capabilities, the degree to which the City's requirements will be met, and prior experience of principals involved.

IV. STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that a committee of council members be selected to: a) evaluate banking services proposals, and b) make a recommendation to City Council for final bank selection.
