## REGULAR MEETING OF FLORENCE CITY COUNCIL MONDAY, AUGUST 9, 2010 – 6:00 P.M. CITY-COUNTY COMPLEX, CITY COUNCIL CHAMBERS, ROOM 604 FLORENCE, SOUTH CAROLINA

**MEMBERS PRESENT:** Mayor Wukela called the regular meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. with the Councilman Billy D. Williams, Councilman Edward Robinson, Councilman Frank J. Brand, II; and Councilman Stephen C. Powers.

MEMBERS ABSENT: Councilwoman Octavia Williams-Blake.

**ALSO PRESENT:** Mr. David N. Williams, City Manager; Dianne M. Rowan, Municipal Clerk; James W. Peterson, Jr., City Attorney; Phillip Lookadoo, Director of Urban Planning and Development; Drew Griffin, Director of Public Works and Utilities; and Tom Shearin, Special Services Administrator.

Notices of this regular meeting were sent to the media with the date, time and location of the meeting. Dwight Dana of the Morning News and Tonya Brown of WPDE TV 15 were present.

#### **INVOCATION**

Councilman Billy D. Williams gave the invocation, which was followed by the Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag.

#### **APPROVAL OF MINUTES**

Councilman Brand made a motion to approve the minutes of the Regular Meeting of July 12, 2010 and the Special Meeting of July 27, 2010. Councilman Bradham seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

# Recognition of Florence Track Club state and regional champions and team coaches

Mr. Chuck Pope, Parks and Leisure Services Department Manager, stated that Mr. Bill Truman, President of the Florence Track Club, was present for the meeting to honor some of the athletes from the program and recognize some of their accomplishments. Mr. Truman introduced the following coaches: Mr. Gil Howarth, Mr. Artie Buxton; Ms. Alicia Truman; Ms. Caitlyn Buxton; Mr. Brian Elmore; Ms. Belinda Elmore; Mr. Isaiah Brown; and Ms. Lois Shake. The following athletes were introduced: Courtney Brown, won the shot put event for the Bantam Girls; William Jones, Youth Boys triple jump winner; Andy Truman, Youth Boys 800 meters winner; the Youth Boys Relay Team, which consisted of Andy Truman, Steven Shake, William Jones and Taylor Cagle ran the 4x800 m in 11:19; a new state record for that age group. Noah Durant, Bantam Boys Hi-Jump Regional Champion and National Meet Attendee, High Jump 1.27meters.

# <u>Recognition of John Taylor, Pitcher for the 2010 National Champions University of South Carolina</u> <u>Baseball Team.</u>

Mr. Chuck Pope, Parks and Leisure Services Department Manager recognized John Taylor. As a Florence resident, John began playing T-Ball at age 5. He then began playing in the Dixie Youth Baseball Program followed by the Dixie Boys Baseball Program at Freedom Florence and McLeod Park. John played one year with the Florence Junior Legion Team and three years with the Florence Senior Legion Team. He played high school baseball at Wilson High School and was named the 2006 Region 6 AAA Player of the Year. He was also named to the 2006 & 2007 South Carolina AAA All State Team and played in the 2007 North/South All Star Game. John played two seasons with Florence-Darlington Tech and pitched for the Florence Redwolves last summer before joining the University of South Carolina baseball team as a junior for the 2010 season. This year the University of South Carolina Gamecocks made their way to the College World Series in Omaha, Nebraska where John pitched in four of the seven games that helped the USC Gamecocks win the 2010 National Championship.

## Mrs. Betty Gregg, Greater Wilson Heights Neighborhood Association

Mrs. Gregg appeared before Council with a concern regarding the repaving of Oakland Avenue. Mrs. Gregg stated Oakland Avenue has been on the repaving list for several years. Mayor Wukela responded that Mr. Drew Griffin, Director of Public Works and Utilities would address the neighborhood association regarding this concern and how quickly it can be repaved.

Mrs. Gregg spoke briefly about the recent break-ins in the Greater Wilson Heights area. As a result of a meeting of the neighborhood association, Mrs. Gregg asked if more police officers could be hired. After the recent break-ins the police presence was doubled in that area and the break-ins dropped dramatically. Mrs. Gregg further stated that the Greater Wilson Heights neighborhood does not want security cameras located in their neighborhood; they would rather have more officers on the street.

In closing, Mrs. Gregg thanked the City for placing benches at Iola Jones Park.

#### Councilman Billy D. Williams – Williams Heights Neighborhood

Due to a recent illness, Councilman Williams requested Councilman Robinson to make this report.

Councilman Robinson reported on a survey he conducted in the Williams Heights neighborhood regarding the recent break-ins and locating security cameras in the neighborhood. Councilman Robinson stated from June 1 to August 5, there were 14 car break-ins and 4 residential break-ins. Councilman Robinson stated that the overwhelming majority of the neighborhood wants the security cameras. Councilman Robinson stated that if the community wants the cameras he will do whatever he can to make that happen. However, he will not do anything that the community does not want to do.

Mrs. Dorothy Hines, a resident of Williams Heights and also a victim of the recent break-ins, stated that there are eight streets and 120 residences in Williams Heights and feels an area this small could be surveyed by the Police Department and whoever is responsible for the break-ins could be caught. Mrs. Hines would like for the Police Department to increase their patrols at night and if there isn't sufficient staff, the City needs to look at hiring more officers. Mrs. Hines does not want cameras in her neighborhood and is not convinced this is the way to go.

Bishop Jimmy Lee Gainey, a resident of the area stated he would like to see more police officers in the neighborhood.

In closing, Councilman Robinson stated this was the first opposition he has heard to the security cameras and added that City Council needs to meet with the community to decide about the cameras. It is up to the people in the community if they want security cameras.

## T.E.A.M. Group

Ms. Lakeisha Gurley, representing T.E.A.M., appeared before Council with concerns of the group. Ms. Gurley stated that T.E.A.M. is disappointed that the Teen Center was lost and asked why the funding was taken away. The Teen Center would have provided the teens in the community a place to display their talents, an after school meeting place, a safe place for entertainment, a place to express themselves with writing plays and acting them out, a place to compete for educational excellence, such as spelling bees, a place to interact with the entire community, such as a community chorale, a place to learn special skills, such as piano, guitar lessons, foreign languages and explore artistic skills, a place to interact with other students.

Ms. Gurley stated T.E.A.M. would like to start a young democratic party in the City of Florence but has doubts because they feel their concerns are not being listened to.

In closing, Ms. Gurley stated she feels the teens were promised a teen center and it was taken away. Ms. Gurley asked to be placed on the October agenda and asked for a written response from each council member on the issues presented.

#### <u>BILL NO. 2010-23 – SECOND READING</u> <u>AN ORDINANCE TO REZONE PROPERTY OWNED BY PARKLAND DEVELOPMENT, 1306</u> <u>W. EVANS STREET.</u>

An Ordinance to rezone property owned by Parkland Development, 1306 W. Evans Street was adopted on second reading.

This request is being made by the owner, Mr. Jim Lyles for Parkland Development, LLC. The request is to rezone 1306 W. Evans Street from B-1 Limited Business District to B-2 Convenience Business Commercial District. The property is shown more specifically on Florence County Tax Map 90046-08-023.

A public hearing was held at the June 8, 2010 Planning Commission meeting and was approved with a vote of 6-2.

Councilman Brand made a motion to adopt Bill No. 2010-23 on second reading. Councilman Bradham seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

## <u>BILL NO. 2010-24 – FIRST READING</u> <u>AN ORDINANCE TO REZONE PROPERTY OWNED BY THEODORE KAMPIZIONES, 108</u> <u>GUERRY STREET, FROM R-4, MULTI-FAMILY TO B-6, INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT.</u>

An Ordinance to rezone property owned by Theodore Kampiziones, 108 Guerry Street, from R-4, Multi-Family to B-6, Industrial District was passed on first reading.

Mr. Philip Lookadoo, Director of Urban Planning and Development reported to Council that this is a request to rezone property located at 108 Guerry Street from R-4 Multi-Family to B-6 Industrial

District. The property is shown more specifically on Florence County Tax Map 90061-04-005. No previous action has been taken on this request. A public hearing for rezoning was held at the July 13, 2010 Planning Commission meeting. The request was approved with a vote of 7-0.

The applicant is requesting to rezone this parcel to B-6, Industrial District. The applicant is the owner of seven adjacent parcels and intends to combine the eight parcels, as required, and expand the business located at that address.

Councilman Brand made a motion to pass Bill No. 2010-24 on first reading. Councilman Powers seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

## BILL NO. 2010-25 – FIRST READING AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND PDD-09-03 TO INCLUDE AN ICU TOWER AND CONNECTING CONCOURSE.

An Ordinance to amend PDD-09-03 to include an ICU Tower and connecting concourse was passed on first reading.

Mr. Phillip Lookadoo, Director of Urban Planning and Development reported to Council that this is an amendment to the Planned Development District shown more specifically on Florence County Tax Map PDD 09-03. The amendment will include a site for an ICU Tower and connecting concourse located on TMS#90102-20-001.

No previous action has been taken on this request. A public hearing for rezoning was held at the July 13, 2010 Planning Commission meeting. The Planning Commission members voted to approve the request with a vote of 7-0.

Councilman Brand made a motion to pass Bill No. 2010-25 on first reading. Councilman Bradham seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

Councilman Powers made a motion to approve Resolution No. 2010-05. Councilman Brand seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

Councilman Powers made a motion to approve Resolution No. 2010-06. Councilman Brand seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

## APPOINTMENTS TO BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS

Mayor Wukela reported that a committee, chaired by Councilwoman Williams-Blake, was appointed to review: 1) the applications that have been received for the various boards and commissions;

2) the qualifications of those applying; and 3) to look into the method by which people are named to the boards and commission and to make recommendations as to whether Council should make any changes and perhaps broaden the criteria of those who are allowed to be named, including perhaps those that do not reside in the City. The committee has a meeting scheduled and will make a report to Council on their recommendations.

# <u>A REPORT ON THE POSSIBLE FUNDING OF SURVEILLANCE CAMERAS AS A DETERRENT TO CRIME.</u>

Inspector Allen Heidler reported that the Police Department received a request to look at what was available in a portable wireless video system. One in particular that was looked at was one that could be monitored and controlled from any computer via an internet connection. It is a self-contained control box that can be mounted onto an existing utility pole or a tree. It can have either one or two cameras attached to it. The cost of this system would be in the \$8-10,000 range depending on having either one or two cameras. One camera will automatically pan for 360° and two cameras will pan 180° in two different directions. It is automatically recorded and can be controlled by an individual that has the password to access the system. This system would be used in areas that are having an influx of crime, and at special events and parades. Oconee Police Department, Pickens County Sheriff's Department and Lee County Sheriff's Department in South Carolina currently use these devices. The cameras are equipped with a GPS tracking system, an alarm and a light in the event they are tampered with. There is an additional infrared system available that would enhance night vision of the camera. The cameras can be moved to different locations as needed.

Councilman Robinson is in favor of the cameras but would not support anything that the neighborhood does not want.

Councilman Powers would like for Council to consider letting the Police Department pursue different pricing and options available.

Councilman Bradham suggested that 1) Councilman Robinson and Councilman Williams meet with the community to see what they wanted to do with regards to installing cameras in the neighborhoods, 2) to get a recommendation from the police department on what system to recommend to the community, 3) to bring it back before Council and 4) to possibly take it before the City County Conference Committee for their review.

Councilman Williams would support what the community wants.

Mayor Wukela asked if there was any objection to Council holding a public meeting in the community to hear their concerns and give staff an opportunity to develop further information that would include pricing and various options. There was no objection from Council.

Councilman Robinson stated that County Councilmen Mumford and Bradley have indicated they will participate in the financing of the camera systems.

#### EXECUTIVE SESSION

Mayor Wukela stated there is a contractual matter for discussion of negotiations incident to a possible contract for provision of services to a neighboring community and a legal matter for receipt of legal advice from retained counsel regarding issues related to a request for public assembly to be discussed in Executive Session.

Councilman Brand made a motion to enter into Executive Session. Councilman Bradham seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

Council entered into Executive Session at 7:10 p.m.

Mayor Wukela reconvened the regular meeting at 7:56 p.m.

Mayor Wukela stated that a legal matter and a contractual matter were discussed in Executive Session. No action was requested and no action was taken.

#### **ADJOURNMENT**

Councilman Brand made a motion to adjourn. Councilman Williams seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:57 p.m.


Map showing the location of the property. Zoning Map Comprehensive Plan Map Staff Report





## **IDENTIFYING DATA**

## BACKGROUND

The applicant requests to rezone the aforementioned parcel to B-6, Industrial District. The applicant is the owner of seven adjacent parcels, to the north, zoned B-6. A paper product refinement and distribution facility exists on the adjacent parcels. The applicant intends to combine the eight parcels, as required, and expand the building. Combining of the lots under a singular zoning district serves to meet current development and zoning requirements.

## **ZONING REQUIREMENTS**

The total site that will be combined meets all B-6 Industrial District requirements. Individually, these parcels do not meet B-6 requirements and must be combined prior to any construction project. The land use of the proposed expansion is permitted in B-6.

## LAND USE PLAN CONFORMANCE

The current Land Use Plan designates the parcel as Industrial Business (IB). The Comprehensive Plan's objective of Industrial Business follows:

"The objective of the Industrial–Business designation is twofold, (1) to create industrial and business development opportunities and (2) to protect existing industrial and business interest from incompatible development.

Areas so designated have been determined to be suitable to such development based on soil conditions, access, and infrastructure (existing or planned)."

The re-zoning and proposed expansion meets this objective.

## **ADDITIONAL CRITERIA FOR CONSIDERATION**

1. What changes have, or are, occurring in the area to justify a change in zoning? The area is a mix of existing IB and EXR land uses that will not be considerably affected by this re-zoning. The dilapidated residential homes on two of the parcels will be demolitioned.

- What are development plans in the area roads, schools, future commercial development, etc.?
   None with exception of the planned expansion associated with this application.
- 4. Is there a reason the current land use cannot continue to be feasible as it now exists? No, although it is incompatible with the adjacent industrial use and therefore not ideal for residential development.
- List some potential uses under existing zoning.
   R-4 is predominately intended for residential land use of a denser scale and related support uses.
- List some potential uses under proposed zoning.
   B-6 accommodates industrial and manufacturing operations. Any development within
   B-6 is required to meet all applicable buffer yard requirements and other zoning regulations.
- Are any of these uses inappropriate for this location, and if so, why?
   The area is and continues to be a mix of light manufacturing operations and residential land use. This rezoning request does not change the existing dynamic of land uses.

- 8. What is applicant's stated reason for requesting zoning? The applicant is seeking to expand their current building of operations by several thousand square feet for additional storage space. The applicant wishes to re-zone their adjacent property and combine all parcels prior to site plan submittal.
- 9. (a) What will be the benefits to the surrounding properties? No change

   No. This rezoning application does not meet The Land Subdivision Ordinance Sec 5.1
   G. of projects the requiring a traffic studies
- What does the purpose statement of the proposed zoning district say?
   B-6 Industrial District: The intent of this district is to accommodate certain industrial uses which, based on their operational characteristics, is potentially incompatible with residential, social, medical, and commercial environs. As a result, the establishment of such districts shall be restricted to areas geographically removed or buffered from such environs.
- 12. Will this proposal meet the intent of the above purpose statement? The close proximity to residential land uses is conflicting with the objective of B-6. The current land use of the property does not engage in industrial activity that is incompatible with residential use. However; the current land use may change and B-6 does allow land uses incompatible with residential. Current land uses, residential and

industrial arein a transitional environment and theoretically conflict in their present state. The extension of B-6 in this case does not appear directly change the characteristics of the area or pose an additional conflict in land use.

## **RECOMMENDATION**

Based on an examination of existing land use conditions and conformance to the Comprehensive Land Use Plan, Staff recommends approval of the re-zoning.




# COMPREHENSIVE MAP PLAN Rezoning Request McLeod Regional Medical Center






## LAND USE PLAN CONFORMANCE

Is there any discrepancy between current or proposed zoning and the Land Use Plan? If so, what is the discrepancy?

No change in land use is proposed. The Comprehensive Plan designates the site for Industrial-Business. The current and future use of the site does not conflict with the Future Land Use plan. The proposed ICU site is centrally located on the McLeod Medical Campus and is complimentary to the surrounding medical services.

Land Use Plan elements that impact the subject property:

The McLeod Health ICU tower meets the objective of the Industrial Business classification.

## **ADDITIONAL CRITERIA FOR CONSIDERATION**

 What changes have, or are, occurring in the area to justify a change in zoning? McLeod initiated PDD 09-03 to move towards a cohesive development plan for their campus. The original PDD had sites for two new parking structures and a pedestrian concourse. The demands for medical service on the hospital require continuous upfits of existing facilities and construction of new facilities. The amendment to the PDD serves to site a modern ICU tower and meet public demand for quality health care.

3. What are development plans in the area – roads, schools, future commercial development, etc.?

The area primarily consists of McLeod Regional Medical Center facilities. It is also surrounded by single-family residential, churches, and retail development. The McLeod center properties exist along some heavily traveled corridors, specifically Cheves and Palmetto Streets. Although McLeod Health is right outside the Downtown Redevelopment District, Cheves and Palmetto Streets (to the west of South Church Street), will undergo major changes as development associated with the Downtown Revitalization Plan continues to unfold.

- Is there a reason the current land use cannot continue to be feasible as it now exists? No.
- List some potential uses under existing zoning.
   Existing zoning allows for all types of commercial uses such as office space, retail, eating and drinking places, financial institutions, etc.
- 6. List some potential uses under proposed zoning.

The Planned Development District allows for any type of uses that have been approved by City Council. McLeod Health has proposed uses such as office buildings, hospital care, parking garages, educational facilities, etc. Once these uses have been approved, no other uses will be permitted. The approved list of uses is binding as long as the Planned Development Zoning District applies to the land.

- Are any of these uses inappropriate for this location, and if so, why? No.
- What is applicant's stated reason for requesting zoning? Over the next few years, McLeod Health proposes major renovation of existing buildings, developing additional healthcare facilities, and improving infrastructure (access roads, parking, utilities, etc.).

- 9. What will be the benefits to the surrounding properties? Benefits to the surrounding properties, as well as the community, include expanding healthcare services of a major healthcare provider.
  - (b) What will be the detriments to the surrounding properties? Residential properties may be loss due to the expansion; however, the future land use map has slated the area for Industrial Business. The purpose of this classification is to promote areas for industrial and business development.
- Is a traffic study required for this petition?

   A traffic study is required for large development projects such as this according to Article V of the Land Development and Subdivision Ordinance. The applicant has developed an traffic study to support additional pedestrian oriented projects.
- What does the purpose statement of the proposed zoning district say?
   Per Section 1.2 of the City of Florence Zoning Ordinance, the purpose of the Planned Development reads as follows:

The intent of the Planned Development District is to encourage flexibility in the development of land in order to promote its most appropriate use; and to do so in a manner that will enhance public health, safety, morals, and general welfare.

Within the PD, regulations adapted to unified planning and development are intended to accomplish the purpose of zoning and other applicable regulations to an equivalent or higher degree than where such regulations are designed to control unscheduled development on individual lots or tracts, promote economical and efficient land use, provide an improved level of amenities, foster a harmonious variety of uses, encourage creative design, and produce a better environment.

In view of the substantial public advantage of "planned development", it is the intent of these regulations to promote and encourage or require development in this form where appropriate in character, timing, and location, particularly in large undeveloped tracts.

12. Will this proposal meet the intent of the above purpose statement?

Yes, the proposal amendment will meet the above purpose statement, as well as the Development Standards set forth in Section 2.6-3 and 2.6-4 of the City of Florence Zoning Ordinance.

- **B.** Because millage was set in the FY 2010-11 Budget ordinance at the same millage as the prior fiscal year (54.9 mills), it will be necessary to amend the budget ordinance to reflect a change in millage resulting from reassessment.
- **C.** The recommended tax rate of 53.7 operating mills has been calculated based on reassessment information received from the Florence County Auditor. The operating millage has also been calculated in conformance with §12-37-251(E) and §6-1-320 of the South Carolina Code of Laws 1976 (as amended).
- **D.** The City was notified on September 3, 2010 that the millage rate needs to be certified to the County Auditor no later than September 21, 2010.

# ORDINANCE NO.

# AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE BUDGET FOR THE CITY OF FLORENCE, SOUTH CAROLINA, FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JULY 1, 2010, AND ENDING JUNE 30, 2011 TO PROVIDE FOR A REDUCTION OF OPERATING MILLAGE DUE TO COUNTYWIDE PROPERTY REASSESSMENT

WHEREAS, §5-7-260 of the South Carolina Code of Laws 1976 (as amended) requires that a Municipal Council shall act by ordinance to adopt budgets and levy taxes pursuant to public notice; and

WHEREAS, the budget adopted by the City Council of the City of Florence for fiscal year beginning July 1, 2010 and ending June 30, 2011, established a tax of fifty-four and nine tenths (54.9) mills upon each dollar (\$1.00) in assessed value of real estate and personal property of every description owned and used in the City of Florence; and

**WHEREAS**, the program of property equalization and reassessment conducted by the Florence County Tax Assessor for the purpose of determining the 2010 millage has now been completed;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the City Council of the City of Florence, South Carolina, in a meeting duly assembled and by the authority thereof that the following section of Ordinance No. 2010-20, the budget for the City of Florence, South Carolina, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2010, and ending June 30, 2011, is hereby amended as follows:

Section 2. Subject to the provisions and requirements of §12-37-251(E) and § 6-1-320 of the South Carolina Code of Laws (as amended), a tax for general operating purposes for the period from July 1, 2010, and ending June 30, 2011, for the sums and in the amount hereinafter mentioned, is and shall be levied, collected and paid into the treasury of the City of Florence for the operational use and service thereof. A tax of fifty three and seven-tenths (53.7) mills upon each one dollar (\$1.00) in value of real estate and personal property of every description owned and used in the City of Florence, South Carolina, is and shall be levied and paid into the City treasury for the credit to the City of Florence for the corporate purposes, improvements, and for the purpose of paying current operating expenses of said municipality. Such a tax is levied on such property as is assessed for taxation for County and State purposes.

All remaining sections of Ordinance No. 2010-20 shall remain unchanged as written.

This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its approval and adoption by the City Council of the City of Florence.

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the City Council of the City of Florence, South Carolina, in a meeting duly assembled and by the authority thereof that the budget for the City of Florence, South Carolina, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2010, and ending June 30, 2011, is hereby amended as follows:

- **Section 1.** That the category of revenues of the General Fund in said budget is hereby amended by the additional appropriations as follows:
  - 10-311-0100 Current Property Tax is increased in the amount of \$91,100 from debt service millage applied to provide for a General Obligation Bond debt service payment in the current fiscal year.
- Section 2. That the category of expenditures of the General Fund in said budget is hereby amended by the additional appropriations as follows:
  - 10-470-0105 General Obligation Bonds (Debt Service Fund) is funded in the amount of \$91,100 to provide for a General Obligation Bond debt service payment in the current fiscal year.
- Section 2. That the category of revenues of the General Fund Capital Projects Fund in said budget is hereby amended by the additional appropriations as follows:
  - 12-380-0000 General Obligation Bonds is increased in the amount of \$40,000 to provide for funding of closing costs not included in the FY 2010-11 Budget for the General Obligation Bond issue.
- **Section 3.** That the category of expenditures of the General Fund Capital Projects Fund in said budget is hereby amended by the additional appropriations as follows:

12-465-0000 General Expenditures (General Fund Capital Projects Fund) is funded in the amount of \$40,000 to provide for a closing costs related to the General Obligation Bond issue.

- Section 4. That the category of revenues of the Water and Sewer Enterprise Fund in said budget is hereby amended by the additional appropriations as follows:
  - 20-374-0100 Build America Bonds Credit Payments is funded in the total amount of \$1,190,400 from interest credit payments to be received in the current fiscal year from the U.S. Department of Treasury for the Series 2010B Revenue Bond issue.

## FY 2010-2011 Budget Amendment Ordinance (continued)

- Section 5. That the category of expenses of the Water and Sewer Enterprise Fund in said budget is hereby amended as follows:
  - 20-470-0101 Water/Sewer Revenue Bonds (Debt Service Fund) is increased in the amount of \$1,190,400 to offset the 35% interest costs related to the Series 2010B Revenue Bond issue that will be reimbursed by the U.S. Department of Treasury under the Build America Bonds program.
- Section 6. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict or inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency or conflict.

#### I. ISSUE UNDER CONSIDERATION

The I-20 Corridor Alliance is requesting a financial commitment from each of the members to provide start-up funds for a period of three years to cover anticipated costs such as preliminary engineering fees when required for grants, legal costs, and any other administrative costs that may be incurred. The start-up dues would be \$10,000 per year for three years.

## II. CURRENT STATUS/PREVIOUS ACTION TAKEN

Former Mayor Frank Willis met with City Council on October 5, 2009, to present an overview of the plans and purpose of the I-20 Corridor Alliance and to request that the City of Florence become an alliance member. This alliance was formed in 2009 under the leadership of Mayor Bob Coble of Columbia and former Mayor Willis, along with representatives from the City of Florence and Kershaw, Lee, and Darlington Counties.

The purpose of the alliance is to seek out and promote opportunities for economic development along the I-20 corridor between Florence and Columbia and in so doing to improve the quality of life for the residents of the jurisdictions along the corridor with enhanced employment opportunities and quality development.

City Council agreed in principle to work with the Alliance to pursue its economic development goals along the I-20 corridor.

## III. POINTS TO CONSIDER

The City of Florence is well-positioned along the I-20 corridor to be a vital part of any economic development initiatives which may be launched, especially on the eastern end of the corridor. As a regional provider of both water and sewer service, the City could play a strategic role in the possible industrial and/or commercial development of the I-20 corridor.

It is, therefore, appropriate for the City to consider being a sustaining member of the Alliance, beginning with providing a portion of the "start-up" financial support to defray administrative and preliminary engineering costs.

Mr. Scotty Davis, Director of Community Services gave Council an overview of what the City Code currently states about nuisance abatement, code enforcement issues and housing.

## Agreement of the I-20 Corridor Alliance

**I. Need:** There is a great opportunity for economic development along the I-20 corridor between Columbia and Florence. These opportunities include:

- Development of this corridor provides a connection characterized by a common sense of purpose and a collaboration to meet common economic development goals.
- High unemployment in the more rural counties through which I-20 is routed could be significantly reduced over time as the corridor experiences the type of quality development that is desired.
- Both Columbia and Florence provide rail links and interstate highway connections which could serve certain of the transportation links which would be needed by industrial development along the corridor.
- Nearby technical colleges could easily help prepare potential workforce elements for new businesses/industries which may locate on or near the I-20 corridor.
- The I-20 corridor is reasonably near the site of the Boeing facility so that spinoff supporting industries may be interested in the corridor.
- South Carolina has the potential to be one of the foremost sites for development of the biofuel industries, as well as abundant solar resources. Why not the I-20 corridor for industrial development related to these resources?
- The local governments along this corridor (both county and municipal) have cordial working relationships and should have no problem entering into intergovernmental agreements to facilitate development initiatives in the area.
- Needs for water and wastewater infrastructure should not be insurmountable in consideration of the availability and/or flexibility of supply along and at the ends of the corridor.

**II. Mission:** The purpose of the I-20 Corridor Alliance is to promote economic development and quality of life improvement along the eastern portion of Interstate 20 between Columbia and Florence by coordinating and supporting regional infrastructure extension and expansion, industrial site/park development and enhancing technical training access. These goals will be accomplished through:

- Regional Marketing/Recruiting
- Expansion of water and wastewater infrastructure to all strategic commercial and industrial areas on the corridor

- Promoting the development of strategically located technical college training centers.
- Collaboratively seek funding for infrastructure through state and federal appropriations, grants and other sources

## **III. Organization:**

- No employees all administrative/technical work done by the members
- Decisions made by a board consisting of the Mayors and Chairmen of County Councils (or designees appointed by the corresponding political jurisdiction).
- City and County administrators would serve as the technical advisory committee and be required to attend all board meetings. This group would provide administrative support to the board, complete grant applications, maintain business accounts, and implement actions of the board.
- Establish start up dues (\$10k/year for three years) to have funding available for preliminary engineering when required for grants, and legal and other administrative costs. The board will designate how the funds will be handled.




